Commences with fresh breezes from the Southward heading W. & W. under the topsails and courses, one sail in sight, (Massasoit of Mattapoisett 750. Hapsdon board)

at sunset the land in sight near Footak, middle part laying to the Eastward under short sail, latter part light breezes from S. E. heading E. N. E. under all sail, and saw the land.

Massasoit.Sunday May 3^d 1857.

Begins with very light breezes from S. S. E. heading to the Eastward under all sail, middle part fresh breezes heading the same, latter part strong winds from S. S. E.

heading to the Eastward under double reefed topsails and courses, the Massasoit in sight. Do endge. Lat. By obs. 24° 00'. Long. By α 48° 30' 30". Bar. 30.1+.

Dolphin.Monday May 4th 1857.

Commences with fresh breezes from S. S. E. heading to the S. W. under double reefed topsails and courses, at 4 P. M. spoke the Massasoit and caught a dolphin,

middle and latter part fresh breezes from S. S. E. heading to the Eastward under double reefed topsails.

Do endge. Lat. By obs. 23° 50'. Long. By α 49° 13' 00". Bar. 30.1+.

Fitted the Galley.Tuesday May 5th 1857.

Begins with fresh breezes from S. and S. E. and squally with rain heading to the N. E. under double reefed topsails and courses, middle part high breezes,

latter part more moderate, put a new covering to the galley and saw several finbacks.

Do endge. Lat. By obs. 23° 58'. Long. By α 49° 03' 15". Bar. 30.1.

Squally.Wednesday May 6th 1857.

Commences with high breezes from S. E. heading S. W. with the main top gallant sail out, middle part moderate, latter part strong breezes from the Eastward and squally with rain, heading to the Southward under double reefed topsails and foresail.

Do endge. Lat. By D. R. 24° 30'. Long. By D. R. 49° 30'. Bar. 30.1+.

Break out.Thursday May 7th 1857.

Begins with strong breezes from E. to E. N. E. and squally with rain, heading to the Southward under double reefed topsails and foresail, middle part laying to the

Southward under short sail, latter part strong breezes from E. N. East heading N. under double reefed topsails and courses, employed breaking out for bread and water.

Do endge. Lat. By obs. 24° 34'. Long. By α 49° 16' 30". Bar. 30.1+.

New Rigging.Friday May 8th 1857.

Commences with fresh breezes from E. N. East with passing clouds, ship under double reefed topsails and courses heading to the Northward, middle part heading on the Southern

tech under short sail, latter part light breezes from the Eastward heading N. and N. E. under all sail except the gaff topsail, rows new fore topsail, clawlines, fore braces and main topsail reef tackles, the carpenter employed fitting studding sail yards.

Do endge. Lat. By obs. 23° 53'. Long. By α 48° 55' 00". Bar. 30.1+.

Porpoises.Saturday May 9th 1857.

Begins with light breezes from E. N. E. heading to the Northward and saw a school of porpoises, middle part

moderate, latter part very light breezes from the Eastward, saw several sulphur bottoms. Do endge. Lat. By obs. 23° 55'. Long. By α 49° 00' 45". Bar. 30.1.

Flour.Sunday May 10th 1857.

Commences with very light airs from E. S. E. heading to the N. E. and broke out for flour, middle part

moderate, latter part fresh breezes from S. S. E. heading E. under the topsails and courses. Do endge. Lat. By obs. 23° 20'. Long. By α 49° 24' 00". Bar. 30.1+.

Sam Robertson.Monday May 11th 1857.

Begins with fresh breezes from S. heading E. S. E. under the topsails and courses, and saw a finback, middle part laying under short sail, latter part strong breezes from S. S. East

heading to the S. W. saw finbacks and spoke the ship Sam Robertson of Fairhaven. Do endge. Lat. By obs. 23° 22'. Long. By α 49° 20' 00". Bar. 30.2.
