

Saturday May 25 1839

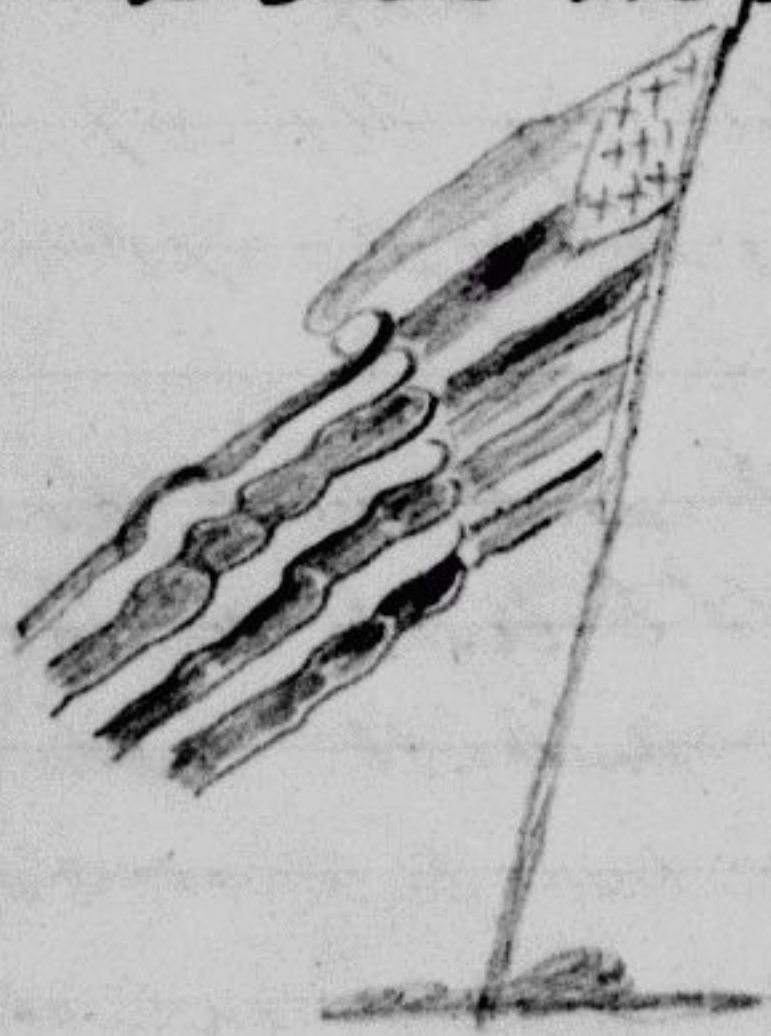
Commencement of these 24 Hours Pleasant

at 7 Saw 2 Briggs Standing to the Westward

Middle Part Wind SW
Latter Part Wind
from SSW to SW and Pleasant Saw a Briggs
On our Lee Bow so Ends this Day Lat by Ob 36 18
Long by DR 72.20
Lat by Ob 36 13
Long by Ob 72.22

Sunday May 26 1839

This day Begins with brisk breeze from the SW
at 2 took in Toppallant Sail and Jack Ship to the
Westward at 3 spoke the Barque Minerva of
Capt Beaford ex. 14 Days but at 7 Calm
Took in Sail and set Quarter Watches

Middle Part Lite air from the Westward
Latter Part the same and Clear day at 6
Maid Sail and Jack Ship to the South
Saw a Sail on our Lee Bow Ends Moderate

Monday May 27 1839

Commencement of these 24 Hours Lite air
from the SW to W at 2 O'clock Jack Ship
To the Westward

Middle Part the same
Latter Part Squally at Day Lite Maid Sail
at 10 O'clock Jack Ship Wind SW at 11 O'clock
Spoke the Matapoisett sent letters the
Minerva a Stern of us at Briggs and Schoor
our weather beam Standing to the Westward
Wind West South West Ends Pleasant

Tuesday May 28 1839

This day Begins with pleasant breezes from
Westward at 8 O'clock parted company with the
Matapoisett Headed to West Wind SW
at 7 Shorten Sail The Minerva on our
Weather beam

Middle Part Strong breeze
and Squally at 8 Range

Latter Part Much
the same Wind SW Maid Short Sail
at 8 Jack Ship Wind SW to WSW at 9
Hard and Strong Rain and Thick Took in
Sail at 11 Calm and a Heavy swell on
pole Deep Took in the Waste Boat and Took up
the Quarter Boat so Ends this Day no Off Observation
