This day begins with brisk breezes from the westward
Heaving SSW at 4 Jack Ship at 7 Shorten Sail
Saw a number of Sails

Middle Part Pleasant

Latter Part Same as the Middle at 4 p M Main
Sail and Jack Ship to SSW at 9 Sailed in
the Stream Edge of which was 72° Jack Ship
to the north So Ends this day

68° water

Friday June 7th 1839

This day begins with a deep sea but Pleasant
Over Head Wind WSW Heaving to the north
water 68 to 68 at 7 Shorten Sails

Sail Saw several vessels Wind W Jack Ship
to the north at 8 Got a Lancer Long 72.25
By Chs 72.20 Lat by DR at noon 36 42
Long by DR 73.22 at 11 Landed for Black
fish & 2 men came on board to look for
Something More So Ends this Day



Saturday June 8th 1839

This day begins with calm weather and soon
th at 1 Took up the boats at 4 Saw Black
fish Lard going quick at 6 Came on board
water 76° Jack Ship to the north at 7 Shorten
Sail Sa Sloop on our lee beam lit air from
the W

Middle Part Perfect Calm

Latter Part The Same water 74 to 70
at 8 O'clock Got a distance of the Sun and
Moon Long 70 45. By Chs at 8 O'clock 71.22
Lat by Ob 36 35 Long at 12 71.20

Sunday June 9th 1839

This day begins with Lite breeze from
the East Heaving NW at 3 W 8 at 5 p
Saw Sperm Whales on our lee bow 6 Point
7 miles of going quick Lard for the same
at 8 sun down Jim up the chase 6 miles of
going quick came on board Shorten Sail
Wind SSW Cloudy Heaving West

Middle Part Strong Breeze and Hard Rain
at 3 Took in the Top Sail at 5 Jack Ship
to the South Wind WSW and Thick with
a Bad swell on took up the boats at 8
Ship to the north at 10 took Ship to the S
Ends thick fog
