 Thomas Stay sail at 3 Sharp Listening Heavy Thunder
 and Torrents of Rain of water from at 58°

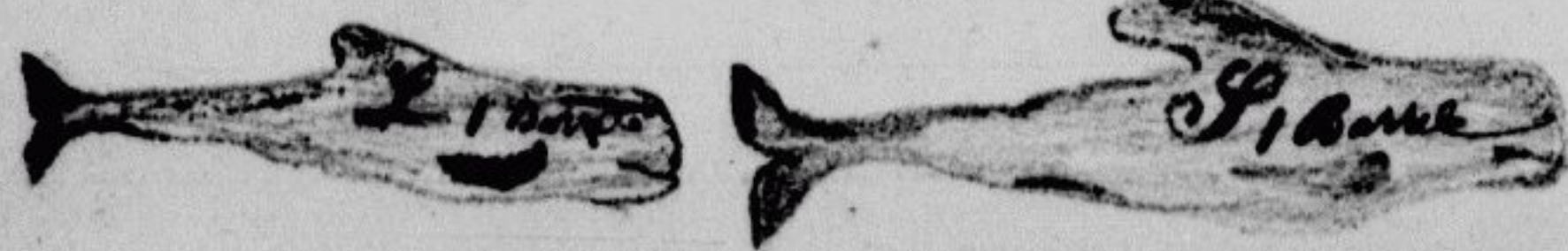

Saturday June 15 1839

This day begins with Lite Breezes from the North and Thick
 at 4 Saw a Hamaphysadite standing W W and over E
 and More Pleasant water at 2 o'clock 58 and Look through
 her Had Soundings Possible it might be Maria Reef
 at 8 Lade down in Purdy Memoir August 22nd 1827
 in the Brig Joseph Henry He states that he saw the
 "Sant" out of water and Sounded in a half of a mile of the
 Gun 20 fathoms He say about 59° E and 64.20 W On the
 Southern Edge of the Stream

Middle Part Same as the
 first Wind E heading S & E Thermometer 76 W
 Latter Part Wind S & E

at 7 Saw Black fish Lound Back Boat got on
 took them along side Strong Gale Thick and Rainy Double Reef
 the Main sail and Top sail pulled the jib at 12 Same
 the Weather and wash of So Ends this day Lett by 2 R 37.28
 Long by 2 R 63.56

Sunday 16 June 1839

This day begins with Thick and Stormy and S & E
 heading S at 6 water 74

Middle Part Wind Light
 Lite S & E heading S W at 11 Jack Ship heading
 S & S W water 70°

Latter Part S & E Wind 12 S W
 at 8 heading S & S Shook out the Reefers Sat 30
 Top gallant Sail at 10 Smokey with Passing Clouds
 So Ends this day Long 6 Knots Lett by 2 R 36.19
 from this day at 4 o'clock in fine Lett by 2 R 36.28
 to 4 o'clock on the 17 1st current Long by 2 R 63.14
 Letting to the West Long at 2 o'clock on the 17
 63.16 and by 2 R 62.52 Chro at 4 62.52

Monday June 17 1839

This day Commences with Strong Breeze from
 the S W and Smokey heading S & E at 4
 o'clock S & S at 6 discovered our Starboard Fire Ship
 from our back Middle Part More Pleasant weather
 of East water 70

Latter Part Moderate at 10 Saw a School of whales
 heading South at 12 Smokey wind
 Lite Lite S W the Shore 30 Saw a sunfish
 and a Large Piece of Squid

Lett by 2 R 35.46
 Variation 4 Points West Long by 2 R 36.07
 Current S 20 miles Long by 2 R 60.57
 Thermometer 70° Long by Chro 61.00
 Gulf head Lite Breeze
