 Saw sperm whales going to the south
 On our Lee Bow Leard Starboard Boat
 Struck Kild Bl at Sundown took it
 Along Side Starboard Side

Middle Part
 Moderate and Cloudy at 4 o'clock Call all
 Hands Cloudy Lite breeze from S to
 the N E heading from W E to E

Latter Part
 Wind Lite and Rainy with Rugged Sea Air
 at 12 got his body in S. Ends this day
 Lat by DR 39 25
 Long by DR 39 35



Monday July 1 1839

This day begins with Lite Rain and Wind from
 the S E at 7 finish Baling his Case

Middle Part More Pleasant watch Employed
 in Clearing the Decks

Latter Part Pleasant
 and Smooth Wind from S to WSW heading to the
 South at 6 Started the works

Lat by Abb 39 40
 Long by Chrs 40 10

Tuesday July 2 1839
 This day begins with Pleasant weather Lite
 breeze from the WSW heading S E

Middle Part the same
 Latter Part

Same at 6 Saw Black fish to Well Employed
 to Look at 12 o'clock Wind WSW and Cloudy
 heading S E

2 Points Variation

 Long by DR 39 35

Wednesday July 3 1839

Commencement of these 24 Hours Lite Breeze
 from the N E S WSW all Hands Employed
 Boiling at 2 o'clock at Search of Sperm Whales
 Broak water on our Lee Bow Galley at that going
 in all directions I could but could not come up
 with them at half past 5 o'clock took up the
 Boats

Middle Part Cloudy Wind ESE heading
 S E

Latter Part Brisk Breeze from ESE to
 E heading S E I saw a sail on our Lee Beam so ends
 this day Cloudy and Rugged Lat by Abb 38 57
 Long by Chrs 38 20
