 and several sails at 7 Took in Sail

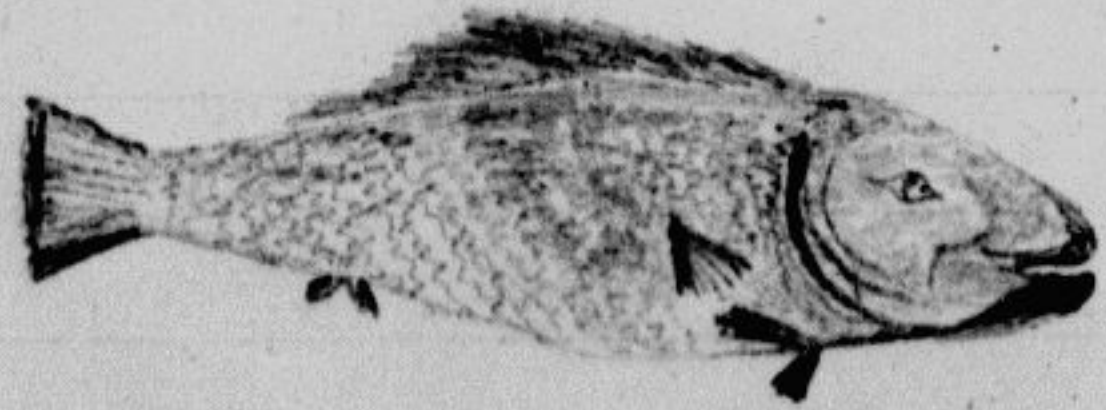
Middle Part Same as the

Tuesday July 9 1839

This day begins, Calms for the winds of Wind
 Cant cruise Saw 9 only of finbacks

Middle Part the same with a Pleasant and beautiful
 Night
 Latter Part the same at half Past 10 o'clock Saw
 200 black fish Mon or less board but it was so smooth
 and still I could not get on Took up the boats at Great
 Number of Grampusses round at 11 Saw a buff
 Spar 75 feet long Load down the boat Great Plenty
 of fish but it caught, long fish So ends this day
 Mending the Fore Sail
 Lat by Obs 38.08
 Long by Chron 39.07



Wednesday July 10 1839
 This day begins with Pleasant breeze from the SW
 heading NE Saw several Sails at 7 Shorten Sail

Middle Part the same
 Breeze from the WSW Latter Part brisk
 Sail on our Lee Bow at 8 Squally and smart
 Shows of Rain at 10 Saw Porpoises at 11 O'clock
 Very Snowy All the water Employed Repairing
 the Foresail So ends this day Lat by Obs 38.58
 Long by Chron 38.15

Thursday July 11 1839
 Commencement of this day Strong breeze
 from the WSW Headed NE Saw a brig on
 our weather Bow at 5 Saw 2 finbacks at 6 Squally
 Single Reg the Mainsail and Topgallant Sail
 Took in and furled single Reg the Fore Top-sail
 Thick and Squally at 7 Shorten Sail heading NW

Middle Part the same with a little more
 buff at 2 Took up the Boats
 Latter Part Strong
 Gales with a bad sea on and Thick and Rainy
 at 5 more Round Wind W Headed SSW So
 Ends this day With the Sun Lat by Obs 39.31
 of One Porpoises
 Long by Chron 38.06
