This day begins with Light Breeze from the WNW Headed SE at 7 Cloudy Over Headed SW at 8 Shorten Sail Headed SW

Middle Part

Cloudy with a Light Drizzle of a Rain at 8 Started the Works

Latter Part Cloudy and Moderate at 7 finish Boiling Headed from SE to E Wind West Water 70° Ends this day

Wednesday July 17 1839

This day begins with Light Breeze from the WNW Headed SE at 7 Shorten Sail Headed to the SW

Middle Part

Cloudy

Latter Part Cloudy at 6 Maid Short Sail Headed E with a Strong Breeze and Ruff Spoke the Ship's Comelious of and 18 day from New London 40 Barrels of Spruce Oil Saw the European 240 of 11 Months out the Ship's Long Bar. at 8 Colock Main Bar 31.48 Shorten Sail Thick and Squally and a bad Sea Over Headed SW to WNW at 10 Colock and English Ship Par under Our Lee with his Long On his Side 31.20 or 30 Headed to the SE and a Bague Ship to Leeward of him So Ends this day

Long by Obs 32.6

Long by Lunar got at 4 Colock on the 18 Deduced to be on the 17

Thursday July 18 1839

This day begins with Strong Breeze from NW Headed NW at 2 Saw a Ship On our Lee Beam Headed to the E at 6 2 English Ships On Our Weather Bow Headed to the Eastward at 7 Shorten Sail

Middle Part More Pleasant

Latter Part Wind NW Jack Ship to the Headed from NW SE Ruff and Thick Saw nothing So Ends this day

Friday July 19 1839

This day commences with brisk Breeze from the NW and Perry Thick Headed to the NW at 3 Colock Jack Ship to the Westward at 7 Shorten Sail at 10 Rose Ship to the NW

Middle Part Same as the first

Latter Part Wind Moderate from NW WNW at 6 Jack Ship to the Westward at 8 Jack Ship to the NW Thick and Ruff at 10 More Clear In Shot at 12 Colock Maid the Land South of Flores by G. Compass NW 38 Miles & Estimation
