

Wednesday July 24 1839

This day begins with Lite breeze from the NW
Running down on the west side of Fyall
Saw a Thousand Grampusset at 5 O'clock at 8 P.M.
a mile of Jack Ship to the W at 7 Shorter Sail

Middle Part Wind Lite Latter Part Calm
Tide set us up so that the Town bore W

Thursday July 25 1839

Commencement of these 24 Hours brisk breeze
from the SW at 1 O'clock went On Shore
Sold 60 Gallons of Oil bought 25 Bushels of
Potatoes 10 of Onions 16 Doz of Eggs at 8 per Doz
at 7 came On Board Betsey a Portuguese Run a
Way

Middle Part Wind Lite from the Town
Quarter Stood Out to the W Latter Part Same
at 8 went On Shore Ship One Portuguese
Berry and Holla day could not find
at 11 Came On Board So Ends this day

Friday July 26 1839
Commencement of this day begins with Lite
breeze from the SW Stood Out to the W

Middle Part Moderate Latter Part the
Wind from the NW Run Down between
Pico and St George at 12 of the Port of
Calyateto So Ends this day

Saturday July 27 1839

Commencement of this day Pleasant
weather at 1 O'clock went on Shore 18 Bushels
of Potatoes and 2 bushels of Onions 72 lbs of
Beef and One Hogg the Cook Run away
Ship a Portuguese came of at 7 O'clock

Middle Part Moderate Run Out Pass
the East End of St George Latter Cloudy
at 12 P.M. at End bore S & W So
Ends this day

Sunday July 28 1839

This day begins with Lite breeze from the SW
at 4 O'clock Spoke the Barge of the City of Sagas town
100 3 Months but bound to the Anslas Bank at 7
End of Tercera bore S & E bound to St Miguel

Middle Part Pleasant Latter Part Moderate Wind SW Head
ed S & E at 8 Saw a Brig Headed to the W Eastward
at 12 Tercera bore W
Left by W 28 37
Long by W 26 17
