

Sunday November 10 1839
Commencement of this day with breeze from ESE Headed to the SE at 4 Past a Barque cutting at 6 Saw 3 Sail a Head Shorten Sail

Middle Part Moderate with Heavy Showers of Rain
Late Moderate Saw a Barque on our Weather Beam at 8 Three Sails at 12 Two Jack Lines at 3 Headed WNW to Ende this day
Lat by DR 18 18
Long by DR 85 16

Monday November 11 1839
Commencement of this day with breeze from the NW Headed to the NW at 1 o'clock Saw White Water on our Weather Beam at half Past 3 o'clock it was a beam of us Loads a boat and pulled up to it Took it to be a dead whale but it Proved to be Nothing but Algae and Bonnetoes in Thousands Pumping and Shipping about to such a Stagger Rate that it Resembled White on Broken Water washing over the back of a dead whale if i had not Examined it I should thought it was a whale on a scale 2 foot under water for such was the appearance of it at 4 or 5 miles off and the Person that saw sea on board of the ship had not time to examine the same would have sworn it to be a dragon as there is a great many shales laid down which never existed in my mind. I write this merely to show how easy it is for a man to mistake. Saw a sail on our Lee Quarter at 6 Shorten Sail

Late Part Windy and weather the same Saw a ship Steaming SW to Ende this day

Tuesday November 12 1839
Commencement of this day with breeze from the NW Headed to the NW at 8 with our Barque Headed to the SE

Middle Part Calm and And Showery
Late Part Breeze and dark Wind SSE Headed 8 with Showers of Rain Saw a sail on our weather Quarter to Ende this day
Lat by DR 17 34
Long by DR 85 10

Wednesday November 13 1839
Commencement of this day Windy and a heavy swell from the SE with a Stagger Rate Headed to the Eastward at 4 o'clock Spoke the Sloop and Joseph of Homers took 6 months out of the

Middle Part went ship to the West Took up the boats
Weather Part More Moderate Set Close Reef Sails and fore sail and went ship to the East Wind SSE at 9 Past the brig Thomas Hindlow of West Port to Ende this day
Lat by DR 17 20
Long by DR 85 31

Thursday November 14 1839
This day begins with breeze from the SSE and cloudy Headed to Eastward at 6 Took in Sail

Middle Part Calm with Late Squalls Headed to the SE
Late Part at 6 Mass Sail Windy Late from the SE and Perry Pleasant and Simon the with a few white Motionless Clouds Clouds Saw 2 Sails on one a Barque Whaler at 12 Jack Ship to the SE to Ende this day
