Commencement of fine weather. Wind. ESE
Headed to the SE at 5 o'clock. Heard
squalls of Wind and Rain at 6 o'clock. Shorten
Sail

Middle Part Moderate. Latter Part
at 5 o'clock sail brush breeze from the ESE
Headed to the SE. Saw nothing. At 6 o'clock
better. S. Ends this day. Lat by Obs 17 27
Long by Obs 34 54

Saturday November 16 1839
This day begins with brush breeze from the ESE
And cloudy. Saw a sail at 6 o'clock. In sail
Headed to the SE

Middle Part Same as the first
Latter Part fine and pleasant. Wind ESE Headed
to the SE. Saw bracks and spouts 6 miles off
Run for them. Which were Humphreys at 12
Heard WSW S. Ends this day. Lat by Obs 18 44
Long by Obs 35.5

Sunday November 17 1839
This day begins with fine pleasant weather. Wind
E Headed WSW at 4 o'clock. Past ahead of 2 English
Brigges. Steaming SW at 6 o'clock ahead of and
English Brigge Headed to the WSW. Took in sail
Middle Part Wind ESE Headed to the

South. Latter Part at 5 o'clock sail Headed WSW
Saw a whale brigg to 4 miles to windward Headed to the SE
Saw a float under his lee which was a fair back on the
Would load. Saw a sail on our lee beam. Ends
ally and a little rain. Lat by Obs 17 37
Long by Obs 35.38

Monday November 18 1839
Commencement of this day brush breeze from
the ESE Headed to the W at 6 o'clock. Shorten sail
Squally. Bore ship to the Eastward

Middle Part Moderate
Latter Part Strong breeze from the ESE Headed
to the W at 12 o'clock under the lee of a whale
Brigg. Standing to the South. S. Ends this day. Lat by Obs 17 30
Long by Obs 36 28

Tuesday November 19 1839
This day begins with Strong breeze from the
ESE Headed W at 6 o'clock. Moderate. Shorten sail
And bore ship to the E

Middle Part Moderate
Latter Part Moderate. In smooth and cloudy at 6 o'clock
Sail Wind W Headed ESE. Saw a on our weather
Bow S. Ends this day. Lat by Obs 17 24
Long by Obs 36.8

Wednesday November 20 1839
This day begins with Squally weather from the
ESE to S and W to SSE. At 5 o'clock spoke
And English Man of war brigg at 7 o'clock the
Brigg Elizabeth of Westport. Cap Cook 76 barrels. 4 Men
Left from Cape de Verde. Reported Capt. Hammond
3 Sisters 210 Brigg. Lat by Obs 20 20

Middle Part Strong breeze
And puff Wind SSE Headed to the Eastward

Latter Part Strong Gale from the same quarter
Set the top sail and took up the boats. Saw a
sail on our weather. Quarter Hove to. S. Ends this day
Lat by Obs 16 52
Long by Obs 35 40
