

Monday December 9th 1839
Commencement of this day fine weather
Wind NE Headed to the SE at 7 Took in
Sail

Middle Part the same
Latter Part Strong Breeze and Rugged
Took in the West Boat to Repair at 8
O'clock Saw a Whaler to the SE
Load for the same its being Squally at the
Time here saw a man of his Hood to the
Eastward in hopes of seeing him again But
No more so Ends this day Lat By Obs 18.39
Long By Chron 35.20

Tuesday December 10th 1839
This day begins with thick and Rany Wind
NE Headed to the W Westward

Middle Part the same
Latter Part Wind NE and Ruff Thick and
Squally so Ends this day Lat By Obs 17.59
Long 36.30

Wednesday December 11th 1839
Commencement of this day Brist Breeze from
Eastward Saw a Sail to Windward Headed to the W
at 5 spoke the two Sisters at 7 Took in Sail and wore
Round

Middle Part Thick
Latter Part
Strong Breeze Breeze from the NE Headed to
the SE at 8 Saw Breaches 100 & 110 Miles of Thick and
Squally with Heavy Showers of Rain so Ends this day
Lat By Obs 18.22
Long By Chron 35.42

Thursday December 12th 1839
This day began with Brist Breeze from the
NE Headed to the SE at 7 wore Round and
Took in Sail

Middle Part Much the
same Latter Part Strong Gales and Squally
with a bad Breeze at 7 wore Round to the W
at 10 wore Ship to the SE Wind NE Saw 2
Sailed so Ends this day Lat By Obs 18.17
Long By Chron 35.30

Friday December 13th 1839
Commencement of this day Strong Gale from the
NE and Ruff at 3 O'clock got a Lunnet
By Measuring the distance from the Sun and Moon
which made the Long 34.52 Chron 34.27 at 6 Took
up the Boats and wore Round

Middle Part More Pleasant
Latter Part Pleasant Over Head But Ruff
Wind NE Headed to the SE at 1 Sailed to
Windward so Ends this day Lat By Obs 18.05
Long By Chron 35.10

Saturday December 14th 1839
Commencement of this day Wind NE Headed
to the SE at 3 O'clock got a Lunnet
By Measuring the distance of the Sun from
the Moon which made the Long 34.46 Chron
35.11 at 7 Took in Sail and wore Ship

Middle Part Same Latter Part
Pleasant over Head But Rugged at 5 Made
Sail and wore Round Headed to the W at 8
Saw a Sail to Windward Saw 2
finbacks so Ends this day Lat By Obs
17.41
Long By Chron 35.28
