Spoke an English Ship from Liverpool Bound to
Rio de Janeiro His Log was 35.40 By two Good
Chronometers Mine was 35.31 Wore Ship to the S.E.
Heavy squalls of wind and rain at 7 Took in
the fore sail and set the Jug sail

No Obs Long By D.R. 35.28

Monday December 23 1839

The S.E. Headed to the N.W. at 7 Wore Ship
to the S.E. Thick and Rainy

Latter Part Strong Gale Ruff Thick and
Rainy Saw 2 sails Merchant man Head S.E. Head-
ed the N.W. So Ends this day Lat By Obs 18.20
Long By D.R. 35.28

Tuesday December 24 1839
Commencement of this day Strong Gale from the
S.E. Headed to the N.W. at 3 o'clock Wore Ship
The Wind the same Strong Gale Heavy Rain with a large
squall on took in the fore sail and Jugsail Set the
Jug sail took up the boats

Latter Part
bought a Lull Set the a Close Reef Jug sail and Double
at 10 o'clock Thick Heavy squalls and torrents of rain
at 11 Took in the Jug sail So Ends this day Wind from
S.E. to S.W. Lat By D.R. 18.35
Long By D.R. 35.7

Wednesday December 25 1839
This day begins Strong Gale from the S.E. to
N.W. Headed to the S.W. to E with Heavy squall
of rain at 3 Set the Jug sail at 6 Past a copper
bunt Brigg Standing to the Westward Took in the
Jugsail

Middle Part the Same as the first
Latter Part Strong Gale and Rugged Wore Round
Set the Jug sail and fore sail Took the Mainsail
Set the Jug sail Wind S.E. Headed S.W. So Ends
this day Lat By Obs 18.50
Long By D.R. 35.30
