

Friday January 17 1840

Commencement of this day fine breeze from the ESE Headed to the SSE at 7 Shorten Sail

Middle Part fine and Pleasant at 4 O'clock were Round to the SE and S of E

Latter Brisk Breeze from the ESE at 10 Saw at 11 a Whale 1 Point on our weather Bow 2 miles of Going Quick Got the Boats Headed the Whale Turn flukes Headed SE Jack Ship to the SE the next Rising she was 2 Points abaft of Beam 5 Miles of Going to Windward and Round to Windward till 12 O'clock Sea nothing more came on Board then Had not seen the Whale So Ends this day

Saturday January 18 1840

This day begins with Sile Breeze from the ESE Headed a S of E at 7 Took in Sail

Middle Part Strong Breeze at 9 Jack to the East at 4 Jack to the West Latter Part Strong Breeze from the SE and Squally Ruff and SE

Ends thick and a little drizzle Latter Part Squally Ruff and SE
Sail by DR 18 10
Long by DR 35 22

Sunday January 19 1840

Commencement of this day Brisk Breeze from the ESE Headed to the Westward at 7 Took in Sail

Middle Part Moderate Latter Part

Wind Sile from the ESE Headed to the West Saw a Whale Berque to Leward So Ends this day fine and Pleasant

Long by DR 35 54

Monday January 20 1840

Commencement of this day fine weather Wind ESE Standing to the NW at 4 Spoke the brig Elizabeth Capt Cook 130 Tons Saw 2 more Whalesmon at 7 Took in Sail

Middle Part fine

and pleasant

Latter Part Squally and Brisk Breeze from the ESE Headed S of W Saw 2 Sail So Ends this day
Sail by DR 16 54
Long by DR 36 30

Tuesday January 21 1840

Commencement of this day fine and Pleasant Wind ESE Headed S of W Saw 1 One Whaler at 6 Spoke the Sagrange Capt Riddle 60 Tons he reported the Berque Odhalia Capt Page 1000 Borne Home Leachy also the Sarah 340 Berque Windward 300 Capt Grinnel and James Windward 80 Charleston Packet 30 Montpelier 100 Chase 70 Willis 400 Saw 2 more Whalesmon at 7 Took in Sail

Middle Part fine and Pleasant Latter Part Squally Strong Breeze from the ESE to SE Ruff Thick and Rainy So Ends this day Headed E to SE

Sail by DR 17 35
Long by DR 36

Wednesday January 22 1840

Commencement of this day Strong Breeze from the ESE Headed SE at 2 More Pleasant Maid Sail Saw a Whalesmon on our weather Beam at 7 Took in Sail

Middle Part More Pleasant

Latter Part fine weather at 5 Maid Sail and Done Round to the North Saw a Whaler ahead So Ends this day all well
