Sails So Ends this at 4 O'clock P.M. got a Lunar
Which made the Long 34.45 Obs 34.16
Lat by Obs 8.37
Long by Obs 35.18

Thursday February 13 1840
Commencement of this day Moderate at 4 O'clock 1 PM
began stupor in Bone at 10 distance 8 miles got a Lunar
Which made the Long 34.47 Obs 34.10 Time by E Headed
at 6 at 7 Saw several Sails and batman on fishing boat

Middle Part Moderate Wind Boffing at 9 O'clock
Saw Perumbees in Bone at 17 to 18 fathoms
Latter Part Light Boffing and Squally at 11 Saw several
Sails Bound to Perumbees at 12 Perumbees Bone N. N. W.
