Commencement of this day Wind from SE
Round to N and from North to NW at 2 then
SE & Thick and Rainy with a strong breeze from E
SE to E Headed at night at 4 O'clock of

Middle Part Moderate Latter Part

Moderate Wind SE Headed at night Pleasant
Painted the Harbour Boats So ends this day
With plenty of Smoak flying fish Lat by Alt 45.57
Long by Mer 43.51
Lat by DK 3.49 Long by DK 42.14

Saturday February 22 1840

Commencement of this day Wind from SE
to SE and Squally

Middle Part Much the same
at 8 O'clock went through broken water
It was so rough that it broke on deck
and up against the boats the swell peaked to come
from the West Left to the wind at bottom with 40
fathoms in a few minutes we was of the reef water
Luff off again Latter Part Squally and

Late Headed at night Lat by Alt 5.7
Long by Mer 45.53
Lat by DK 4.51 Long by DK 43.41 Current W 37 miles

Sunday February 23 1840

Commencement of this day Wind from SE to SE &
Headed at night with Squalls of Rain continually

Middle Part More Pleasant

Latter Part Same as the
first Headed at night the Carpenter is about the same
Lat by Alt 6.6 Long by DK 45.11 Lat by Alt 6.24
SE to 20 miles Current Long by Mer 47.42

Monday February 24 1840

Commencement of this day Squally with a fresh
breeze from the SE Headed at night

Middle Part Strong Breeze

Latter Part the same and Headed at night
With all sail set So ends this day Lat by Alt 7.46
Lat by DK 7.37 Long by DK 47.08 Long by Mer 49.31
Current the last 24 hours

Tuesday February 25 1840

This day begins with the last Headed at night

Middle Part Strong breeze with a large swell
Latter Part Much the same Headed the same
Continual Squalls of Rain SE Lat by Alt 8.52
Lat by DK 8.39 Long by DK 49.19 Long by Mer 52.25
Current W 23 miles Southwesterly

Wednesday February 26 1840

This begins with the wind from SE to SE &
Headed at night

Middle Part Squally
Latter Part the same change the water to a dark
green ends cloudy Lat by Alt 10.26
Lat by DK 9.52 Long by DK 51.18 Long by Mer 54.54
Current at 45 W 30 miles

Thursday February 27 1840

Commencement of this day Strong breeze from the
East Headed at night Squally with Heavy Rain
at 4 O'clock lowered To the bottom

Middle Part the same Latter Part Same
at the first Water Part Dirty Green Saw a number
of black Headed Gulls So ends this day

Lat by DK 11.18 Long by DK 53.27 Lat by Alt 11.50
Long by Mer 56.22
Current at 60 E 5 miles
