Commencement of this day cloudy with a strong breeze from the E Headed S.W. Saw a large and small whales at 6 Took in Sail and Took up the Boats

Middle Part Same as the first at 9 O'clock Past a Ship kind of S.E. 6

Latter Part cloudy at 5 Maid Sail set down the Boats at 8 O'clock Commenced to Run Wind S.E. of S Headed E.S. at 11 Took in Sail

Latter Part 29.32
Long by the 78.00

Saturday April 6 1840

This day begins with more pleasant weather over Head at 2 O'clock Maid Sail kind S.E. Headed E at 6 Took in Sail

Middle Part Moderate with the Wind from the W to S.W.

Latter Part Wind W by S and Light Saw two Sails Headed to the Eastward So ends this day

Latter Part The Same Only at 11 O'clock Sailed kind W to S.W. Headed S. to S.W. Saw many Sails So ends this day

This day begins with a Little Breeze from the S.W. Headed S.W. Saw 3 or 4 Merchant Ships Headed to the Eastward at 6 Calm Took in Sail Middle Part Calm

Latter Part Little Breeze from the South at 8 Calm at 12 Calm So ends this day

Tuesday April 7 1840

This day Commences with a calm
