O'clock Took up the Boats the Whales killed and
Cannon 3 Miles a Head at Half Past 2 O'clock
Heavy Looking Squall in the NW Thick and
Rainy Little or no wind at 4 O'clock Laid up
Saw Saw fish Porpoises and Saw the whales
5 Miles of Land Saw them one Rising Obly
at Sundown came along side Took up the
Boats Shorten Sail

Middle Part Moderate
Latter Part Squally with
Strong Breeze from the NW Headed
to the Eastward at 11 Made Short Sail and won
this day Lat by Alt 30.50
Long by Chron 77.40

Tuesday April the 14 1840
Commencement of this day Strong Gale and Squally

Middle Part Same Latter Part fine
Pleasant Weather Wind SE Headed SW
to End this day Lat by Alt 31.10
