75.12 Long by Thro 16.38

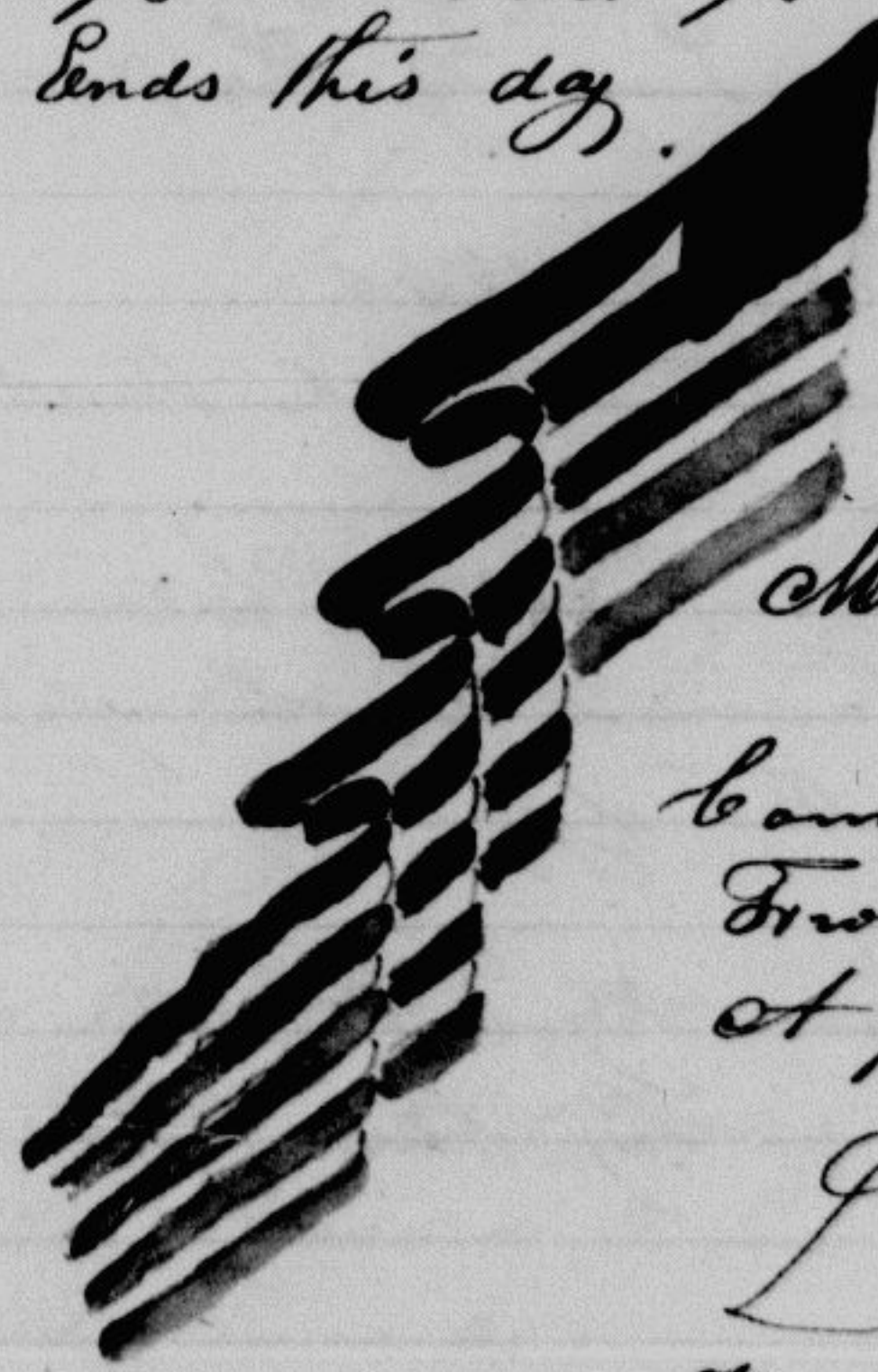
Friday April 17 1840

and took in the Gills at
Middle Part Moderate

Latter Part Calm with a Large Swell on
Saw several Sails So Ends this day

Saturday April 18 1840
Commencement of this day Calm Saw 3 Sails
Middle Part Calm
Latter Part Wind S.W. fine Pleasant Weather
Headed S.W. Saw not any thing So Ends this day

Long by Day 15.2
Long by Thro 15.12

Sunday April 19 1840
Commencement of this day Lite Breeze
From the S.W. Headed S.W.
Middle Part
Moderate Latter Part the same Wind
S.W. at 7 Tack Ship to the Westward at 8
Spoke the Josephine of N York from Mobile Haven
to Liverpool Got some Papers on his Log which
Was 75° 00" Lat 75° 04" Tack Ship to the S.W.
So Ends this day
Latter Part 32.11
Long by Day 14.46



Monday April 20 1840
Commencement of this day Lite air
From the S Headed S.S.E. Saw
at fur back

Middle Part Calm
Latter Part Part Pleasant
Breeze from the S.W. Headed S.W.
Sick up a Plank and a Bag of Salt
Water Saw a fin back So Ends this day
Latter Part 31 56
