

Tuesday April the 21 1840
This day begins with a breeze from the
SW Headed to

Middle Part the same
At 10 Jack Ship Latter Part Squally
With Bofflin Winds and Ruff Headed
From W to SW Round S & E So Ends
This day Thermometer 72° ... Lat by Alt 31.3
Long by DK 75.2

Wednesday April the 22 1840
Commencement of this day Strong Gale and Cloud
Wind SE at 1 O'clock Close Reef at 6 Jack in
the Top Sail and took up the Boats Saw 4 or 5
Sails
Middle Part Same
Latter More Moderate and Pleasant over
Head Made Short Sail Headed W to W by N
So Ends this day Thermometer 72° Lat by Alt 31.52
Long by Chron 75.30

Thursday April the 23 1840
This more Moderate Made all Sail Wind
SE Headed SE
Middle Part Part
Latter Part Same Took up
the Stern Boat So Ends this day
Thermometer 72° to 71° Lat by Alt 32.3
Long by Chron 75.50

Friday April the 24 1840
Commencement of this day Calm at 5 O'clock
Saw black fish 5 miles of going Duck Land
But could not catch up with them at 7
Took up the Boats and took in sail

Middle Part Calm
Latter Part Little breeze from the S Headed
E So Ends this day Lat by Alt 32.9
Thermometer 72° W ... Long by Chron 75.5

Saturday April the 25 1840
Commencement of this day Calm Saw a
Number of finbacks and bowfish

Middle Part Same as the first
Latter Part Little breeze from the SE
Headed SE Saw a number of finbacks
So Ends this day Lat by Alt 32.6
Thermometer 72° W Long by Chron 74.33

Sunday April the 26 1840
Commencement of this day Calm and Boudy
Saw a number of finback at 6 Pick up a Quater
of a Bale of Cotton
Middle Part Boudy
Latter Part Boudy with a little breeze from the
SE to SSE Headed SE 4 or 5 Sails of Merchant
Men Headed to the SE Ends with a brisk breeze
and Smokey
Thermometer 72° W Lat by Alt 32.31
Long by Chron 74.18
