

Thursday June 27<sup>th</sup> 1824

These 24 hours commenced with light airs  
all hands employed in taking care of oil at  
6 o'clock whales in sight hoisted and got one  
line along side at about 9 the last part of these  
24 hours all hands employed in boiling and storing  
down

Friday 28<sup>th</sup>  
First part all hands employed in cutting in  
at 8 finish cutting all hands went below at  
5 o'clock commenced boiling and cutting up the  
junk last part whales in sight hoisted without  
success it being calm and the whales very  
shy so ends these 24 hours

Saturday 29<sup>th</sup>  
First part light airs very warm for the  
season whales in sight at 2 P.M. hoisted  
but without success the whales very shy but a  
plenty of them these 24 hours and all employed  
in boiling

Sunday 30<sup>th</sup>  
Fine weather all hands employed in boiling  
out and blubber getting low at 6 saw a whale  
hoisted & beat the whale went down when he  
came up he was some way off and it being warm  
came on board without success, at 6 o'clock  
down so ends these 24 hours

Monday July 1<sup>st</sup> 1824  
These 24 hours had a fine breeze from the East  
at daylight sent a ship about one hour after  
saw whales within a 1/2 of mile from his  
hoisted and after a barrel row got the ship  
along side then got him along side so ends these 24 hours

Thursday July 2<sup>nd</sup> 1824

First light airs fine weather stowed  
a fare of oil about 2 1/2 lbs cut in a whale  
at 8 o'clock commenced boiling at 9 o'clock  
on the head cut it in nothing more very  
special for these 24 hours

Friday 3<sup>rd</sup>  
Fine breeze from the N and W steering  
by the wind still boiling saw blackfish at 8  
at 10 saw whales hoisted and got one  
line along side stowed down a fare of oil about  
2 1/2 lbs at 3 o'clock hoisted on the whale and  
cut off his head so ends these 24 hours

Saturday 4<sup>th</sup>  
First part quiet & strong breeze from the  
N and W called all hands at day light and  
commenced cutting on the whale at 3 o'clock  
over with and commenced boiling at 7 o'clock  
the whale 20 or 30 in sight so ends these 24 hours

Sunday 5<sup>th</sup>  
All hands employed in taking  
care of the oil first part rather windy  
with some rain at 11 o'clock finished boiling  
out this barrel turned up about 2 1/2 lbs and  
then commenced on the top of the nothing  
more very special for these 24 hours except  
being rather grossy quiet a heavy mist on 25

Saturday 6<sup>th</sup>  
This day fine weather all hands employed in boiling  
out at 2 P.M. water down and washed of deck  
so ends these 24 hours
