

Thursday July 18th - 1844

These 24 hours strong breeze from the N.W. steering to the S.W. saw one sail nothing more very special so ends the day

Friday 19th
Strong breeze from the N.W. at 9 P.M. in a large breeze it being thick we saw nothing more of it last part wind increased with rain so ends these 24 hours

Saturday 20th
These 24 hours commences with a strong breeze middle and fast part wind about single reef top sails saw one sail steering off N.W. a man-of-war & last part good weather but none to be seen so ends the day

Sunday 21st
This day commences with a strong breeze from the N.W. standing on the wind with the foreward masts on board last part the wind and sea went down nothing in sight this day very special

Monday 22nd
First part strong breeze from the N.W. standing on the wind foreward masts on board saw one sail in sight saw flying squid and Jumper 8 but no whales so ends these 24 hours

Tuesday 23rd
This day commences squally with 9 sails in sight at 1 P.M. the wind shifted last part fine weather steering off N.W. a boat saw a great number of flying squid and fish at night top sail last carrying 6 with foreward masts on board so ends the day

Wednesday July 24th - 1844

These 24 hours commences light winds at 9 A.M. spoke the Brig Sagrada of Chittagong set from about 18 miles out at 11 A.M. also saw the Bar (Chase of Westport but did not speak her so ends this day

Thursday 25th - 1844

These 24 hours commences with a fine breeze from the N.W. standing on the wind with the foreward masts on board at 10 saw a sail at 6 P.M. saw whale spout 11 times then went down the sun was about one hour high when he came up it was sun set the whale was going about 10 or 12 miles as we sailed faster but he was about 2 1/2 miles of the first time the time first about 3 P.M. so ends the day

Friday 26th
This day commences with a fine breeze from the N.W. steering different courses nothing in sight of any consequence

Saturday 27th
Fine weather one sail in sight the wind shifted to the N.W. standing on the foreward masts heading off at night single reef top sail steering off N.W. so ends the day

Sunday 28th
All these 24 hours fine weather but no whales saw a plenty of flying fish gaily and in abundance & the about N.W. steering off at night standing on the wind with single reef top sail & so ends the day
