

Monday July 7th - 1822

This day commenced with a fine breeze from the E at 11 I took sail whaling at 12 P.M. chased the boats and got 33 to them along side but 9 of them in 30 the rest of them went to the Westward at 8 set the watch forer watches. So ends the day

Thursday ^{the 3rd}
 All day bright & clear all harvest and corn
 shearing away the harvest at 10 o'clock clear ready
 for cutting hooked and cast in the other at
 noon got dinner & cleared away the harvest at
 & started the work at all the 1st house a heavy
 & snow on a bad sea some rain and lightning
 so ended the day

Wednesday 31
Fine weather all hands employed in
boiling at 12 P.M. cooked down is nothing
in sight this day

Thursday the 11th August 1824
All hands preparing for standing down
etc & saw a whale breasted & breasted and further
for him the whale went down and that
was the last of him supposed he was going
from us not having a very good look out about
4 hours before sunset saw a fish of some kind
spout about 20 times and disappeared supposed
he was a whale & coopered some of the oil
and cleared up deck & stowage of heavy calum

Had an the
Halls with hands at any night broof out
far, standing down at 8 Lane number 66
and got 2 to 3 there every side at 9
then stowed down 50 lbs of oil so much
the day.

Sheltered by August 3rd — 1832
 We had all hands at day light and
 commence cutting in it. I had them
 in and started the works at 9 saw wheel
 at 3 hours and got one to him along
 side of these 4 hours makes working out 10 goes
 the times

Sunday the 4th
 Platted all hands at 6 commenced cutting
 at 9 at 2 had him all in started the works
 again so ended the day.

Monday the 3^d
I left this ^{day} sailing out and at 1 P.M. ^a storm
drew about 12 barrels of sea greenhouses and
humpbacks also the carcasses of the whales
we cut in Saturday nothing more very
special for the day.

On Tuesday the 6th
The weather still boiling at 8 AM. would
down at 10 speak the Pacific of Peru^{trans}
11 months out 220 fms reports the outward
500 fms from 200 fms 200 fms saw a ship
merchant so enters the bay.

What a muggy day
This day rather windy with rain at day
light - collected all plants and commenced stowing
down at 2 finished and washed off such stores
down so ~~the~~ I saw one rail but no whistlers
so goes the time

Thursday 8th
This day squally with rain and black
fish: some hooked other fish of some kind
make white water streaks for them to
nothing more of them so ended the day
