

Wednesday August 27th 1844

First part strong breeze from the N. by E. standing on the wind heading to the S. W. saw two sail also a plenty of flying fish and gulf weed saw grampuses but no whales. latter part calm at sunset set in sail as usual so goes the time

Thursday 28th

This day strong breeze from the N. by E. standing on the wind heading to the S. W. saw two sail. standing to the E. at night single reef top sail fore sail and stay sail. nothing in sight of any consequence so ends the day

Friday 29th

All this day light breeze from the N. by E. standing on the wind heading to the N. and W. at night breeze all sail standing two watches nothing in sight very remarkable so goes the day

Saturday 30th

All hands employed in ship's duty such as cutting down &c at 10 P.M. wind hauled S. by E. by evening N. by E. light winds and a heavy swell on running N. by E. so ends the day

Sunday 31st

This day commences with breeze from the N. by E. last part wind N. by E. standing on the wind with the latbores tack on board heading N. by E. quiet a strong breeze fair weather so ends the day

Monday 1st

This day strong breeze from the N. by E. and S. by E. all sail in several times part moderated some carrying top sail so goes the time

Tuesday August 30th 1844

This day light winds and calm all hands employed in ship's duty a plenty of flying fish and gulf weed but nothing of any consequence so ends the day

Wednesday 31st

Strong breeze from the N. by E. standing on the wind with the latbores tack on board all sail out until 1 P.M. then set in top gallant sail so ends the day

Thursday 1st

Breeze 24 hours strong breeze from the N. by E. standing on the N. by E. saw several sail at 1 P.M. saw three grampuses nothing more of any consequence so ends the day

Friday 2nd

Strong winds from the N. by E. standing on the wind heading N. by E. suddenly with rain saw several sail last part calm later that week was at the southern edge of the gulf stream so ends these 24 hours

Saturday 3rd

All this day strong breeze from the N. by E. standing on the wind heading N. by E. and W. at one P.M. set in the fore top sail have to cut single reef main top sail at 7 set the fore top sail so ends these 24 hours

Sunday 4th

Strong gale from the N. and W. standing on the wind from N. by E. to N. by W. very squally and a heavy swell and saw several mast every way top all sail several times so ends the day
