

Sunday November ^{the} 24 - 1844

Thick smoky weather with the wind to the Eastward, at sun rise raised land. With Island bearing N by W Dist 40 miles at 11 AM sent a boat a fishing to the Booby rock at 4 PM spoke the Goshawk we learned of Bremer's capture 7 months out we saw the boat come on board at 8 PM with about 20 fish Messieurs glasses steering N by E. saw land. At 10 PM bearing N by E at 8 PM steering N by E

Monday ^{the} 25

Wind to steering different courses saw 4 Jago dogs at sunset land still in sight about 30 miles off bearing N by E. saw nothing but part strong breezes steering N by E the day

Tuesday ^{the} 26

Which cloudy weather with a fine wind from the N by E steering N by E nothing sight except flying fish at 1 PM took out for water at night saw a porpoise

Wednesday ^{the} 27

Wind and weather as usual saw a porpoise and porpoises hit one with an iron but met with no success, steering N by E latter part wind blowing saw one sail in sight

Thursday ^{the} 28

This day wind blowing first part light air steering N by E saw one sail off our lee beam & some thunder and lightning with rain

Friday November ^{the} 29 - 1844

Squally with rain, wind to the Eastward steering N by E, saw several sail at 4 PM discovered a great number of small fish such as ship fish and last part porpoises around us several

Saturday ^{the} 30

Wind N by E steering by the wind saw several sail, & small porpoises, at 4 PM saw spouts, loaded the boats but see nothing of them in the boats the ship keeps see them to the windward supposed them to be killers came on board again all this day rainy with a light breeze

December, Sunday ^{the} 1 1844

Light air from the N and to steering on the wind with squally rain on board saw two sail, middle part no rain a phantom so ends the day

Monday ^{the} 2

This day as usual calm with squalls of rain, saw several sail, at 3 PM saw black fish loaded the boats, without success, at 4 PM saw a shark and saw some small fish around ship fish

Tuesday ^{the} 3

First part light air from the N steering by the wind heading about N by E saw several sail, & small black fish but did not load the boats middle and last part more wind
