

Thursday January 30th - 1825

All this strong winds but fine weather
and sail in sight saw several shoals
of porpoises & heavy swell from
the S. all this day steering to the
Westward no whales in sight yet.

Friday 31st

This day commenced with a light
breeze from the S. steering by the
wind saw porpoises fastened to on
the iron & rudder.

Saturday February 1st - 1825

Fine weather wind to the North moved
at 7 P.M. saw whales heard the
boats pushed up to one of the we
perceived us being very shy we
did not want them he was
a poor fish came on board the
whales went eyes out to the wind
ward had run of them until
it is so ends the 24 hours Log 36.25

Sunday 2nd

Fine weather whales in sight
all day chased without success
saw 8 ships boiling and chased
whales so ends the day Log 46.18

Monday February 3rd - 1825

Fine weather called all hands to
surprise saw a ship off our bow
to of a mile. of some 1/2 on board high
a whale came up in our wake
boarded a boat immediately at
8 the boat fastened killed him
took him along side at 11. It
cut his head off and took his body
in by sun set so ends this day.

Tuesday 4th

All hands employed in ships
saw 8 & hooked on the head took
the junk in and barked the case
at 12 started fire in the works
so ends 24 hours

Wednesday 5th

All these 24 hours employed in
boiling so ends the day

Thursday 6th

Strong gale with squalls of rain
still employed in boiling at 10
It cooled down rode the boat
under took him of the crabs
came very near touching his
more very special for this day

Friday 7th

Strong gale of wind from the
S. at 11 It cooled the
boarded boat of the crabs stole
him in every trap made a fine
bag to his let him turn a turn
in coming so ends the day
