

Wednesday February 28th 1845

First part strong breeze from the S.W. & last fine weather but a heavy sea running no whales in sight so ends the day

Thursday 29th
Still this day fine weather but no whales in sight so goes the day

Friday 30th
Light airs fine weather steering to the Eastward at 4 P.M. saw whales at 5 loaded with about 15 minutes high positioned the whale took the line and went off to sea

Saturday 1st March 1845
Light winds from the S.W. steering different courses for whales saw grampuses and porpoises at night took in sail as usual

Sunday 2nd
Strong breeze nothing in sight of any consequence

Monday 3rd
Wind and weather the same but times in and out

Tuesday 4th March 1845

Same weather wind S.W. steering on the wind heading to the S.W. at 5 P.M. saw a whale and about forty thousand porpoises the whale went down in the mist & then we heard the boat the next time he came up about 3 miles off the beam 5 minutes high came on board took in sail as usual saw whales 3 times more came along in hard times but can't be kept

Wednesday 5th
First part fine weather wind S.W. saw grampuses and porpoises & last part strong wind but a clear sky nothing more worth noting

Thursday 6th
Light airs fine weather saw some fish but no whales so ends the day

Friday 7th
Same weather light airs nothing in sight of any consequence took in sail in this day strong S.W. wind & so ends the day

Saturday 8th
All this day light airs from the Eastward steering by the wind saw one sail & several different kinds fish but no whales either last times
