

Monday March 2nd 1845

Strong breeze from the S saw one ball and several grasshoppers so ends the day

Tuesday 3rd

This day fine weather but a strong breeze from the N. & spritz the S. beach with rain so ends out along the beach with our barrels nothing more of any consequence

Wednesday 4th

Strong gales from the East standing to the S and E with close reef the sails fore sail and sea try sail nothing in sight

Thursday 5th

Strong breeze from the S and N. trying to unlash the reef top sail at 8 at 9 a whale came up about a quarter of mile off and went down in a spray of rain &

Friday 6th

Fine weather at 8 saw a whale breasted at 9 at 9 a fastener and at 10 in about 15 minutes the fine fastener came on board & y.o.

Saturday 7th

Nothing in sight except a few birds fine weather, birds times so ends the day

Monday March 11th 1845

Fine weather, wind from the Eastward. This day employed in repairing the fish & no fish in sight to day

Tuesday 12th

All hands employed in drying fish, nothing in sight off the fish kind

Wednesday 13th

This day fine weather & nothing in sight

Thursday 14th

Light rain and showers of grain at 8 about the Brig. Drift of drift & mion this out 190 lbs lost two men &

Friday 15th

Strong gales from the N at 8 at 9 saw a whale breasted & showed fastener again at 9 killed him to him & along side & saw a merchant Brig

Saturday 16th

Trying to unlash the reef the Captain with the whale & a strong breeze latter part wind went down some and hauled to the off so ends the day
