

Saturday April 12<sup>th</sup> 1845

Went to the Eastward steering  
W. by N. in fine weather no fish  
in sight. All hands employed  
in repairing the rigging.

Sunday 13<sup>th</sup>

Fine weather with the wind to  
the Eastward steering N. by E. &  
saw a pinkish but no whales.  
Last part thick and raining.

Monday 14<sup>th</sup>

This day strong breeze with signs  
of rain, steering N. by E. by W.  
arrived at 10<sup>00</sup> a.m. last part wind  
(W.) nothing in sight.

Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup>

First part wind to the steering of N. by E.  
by E. mistle calm last part fine  
fine weather but no whales. Lat. 23° 25'

Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup>

Light winds from the Eastward  
steering N. by E. at four struck  
green water & saw dolphins at  
five saw land bearing N. by W.  
Lat 20 miles.

Thursday 17<sup>th</sup>

This day commenced with light  
winds Cape this bearing N. by W.  
steering so at 9 o'clock came two  
anchors in sight further water  
running bottom & under the day.

Friday April 18<sup>th</sup>

Light winds at eight weighed  
anchors and made tack to go  
the tide turned against us came  
to anchor again so was the day.

Saturday 19<sup>th</sup>

At 10 took out anchor and went  
out at three o'clock this bearing  
off 10<sup>00</sup> miles last part fine  
weather the Cape bearing S.

Sunday 20<sup>th</sup>

Fine weather steering N. by E.  
it run down Cape San Juan  
bearing N. by E. Lat 35 miles.

Monday 21<sup>st</sup>

Light winds. Got ground bearing  
N. by E. steering for it at five the  
came to in 10 fathoms water at sun  
down weighed anchor and twice  
in 10 fathoms covered the day.

Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup>

This day fine weather no more  
dolphin water. Liberty on the  
nothing more of any consequence.

Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup>

In port at 10 o'clock there is still water  
may in paint & oil and in  
wood water & fruit but no vegi-  
tables excepting 1 barrel of yams  
& sent a boat to the Cape for  
main for paint oil & to keep the  
time.
