

Saturday May 18th 1825

First part calm at 11 a light breeze springing up off shore & weighing anchor. but no way let it go again at 12. It proved being 4 miles so ends the day

Sunday 19th

At 10 took our anchor in 20 fathoms water with the wind off shore middle part calm at 2 P.M. wind S. standing on the wire. Lathams took aboard. It proved being 1 P.M. Dist 30 miles so ends the day

Monday 20th

Light winds from the Eastward steering by the wind with light tacks on board saw several sail at sea down land bearing 11th Dist 30 miles last part more wind

Tuesday 21st

Fine weather but a strong breeze from the N.E. standing on the wire bearing 12 by 1 at 10. It proved the top sail a short heavy sea on land at sight

Wednesday 22nd

Strong breeze from N.E. standing on the wire to the Eastward saw one sail but nothing of any consequence

Thursday May 23rd - 1825

This day strong breeze from the N.E. carrying single reef top sail nothing in sight except one sail at 8 P.M. took in the Jib and top sail all this day heading about 160

Friday 24th

First part strong winds from the N.E. middle and last light steering 16 by 15 nothing in sight for this day

Saturday 25th

This day fine weather light air from the N.W. steering 16 by 15 sent down the fore top sail and sent another in nothing in sight this day

Sunday 26th

Light air fine weather saw a great number of birds and several fin backs last part wind S.W. standing on the wire so ends the day

Monday 27th

Wind N.E. standing on the wire fine weather & saw several fin backs and birds a plenty nothing more

Tuesday 28th

This day fine weather with a light breeze from the N.E. standing on the wire to the N.E. nothing in sight of any consequence
