

Saturday June 14th 1825

This day fine weather light wind
a sail two porpoises and seen
a grampus no whales in sight
dusk times

Sunday 15th
First part a light breeze from
the N.E. middle calm tack ship
at 2 P.M. standing to N.E. wind
hauled to the N.E. single reef the
topsail 24 25 26

Monday 16th
This day commences with a
light breeze at 6 A.M. speak from
Boston bound to the East
got some late papers to

Tuesday 17th
Squally with rain & standing
on the wind heading to the
S. at 7 P.M. reef top sail

Wednesday 18th
This day squally with rain
led S. by the N.E. wind
of any consequence until from
the S. 3

Thursday June 19th
A day light saw land
Lerdine. Hoped at 8 P.M.
come to in 6 fathoms water &
cross the day
Friday 20th
A day light saw land
of any consequence

Monday July 27th 1825

Nothing to say in the
day from the N.E. of S. wind
a fishing &

Tuesday 28th
This day fine weather strong breeze
went a fishing, saw porpoises
and whales

Wednesday 29th

Nothing of any consequence saw
whales until late in the day
on shore & fired 2 guns
it being a hot day with the

Thursday 30th
A day saw a lot of
her of whales, saw two porpoises
and so much the

Friday August 1st 1825

Nothing of any consequence
until this day at sunrise saw
away to the N.E. and got on
while to the N.E. side
at 11 o'clock, and then in
by night so ended the day

Saturday 2nd
A day saw employed in
fishing, saw whales but
did not have so much
the day
