

Monday, August 11th - 1852

This day fine weather still
boiling at four o'clock dawn
and washed off to sea whales

Tuesday 12th

Have whaled hard, without
success so ends the day

Wednesday 13th

Boiled all hands at day light
and hoisted for whales at 3
o'clock. Came on board and to
see down the oil. At 11³⁰ the
ship got under weigh
and went to sea so ends the day

Thursday 14th

This day the same story over
again &

Friday 15th

Looked for whales in the morn-
ning came on board at 8
hoisted again after dinner pas-
saged. Once killed the whale
it being night and the whale abo-
ut five miles from the coast. As
one of the islanders came on board
and we did not come in
board a hard chase and nothing
coming so goes the tale

Saturday 16th - 1852

This day fine weather with the
wind S.W. standing. At 10³⁰
A.M. by 11 o'clock and at 12³⁰
the ship at 3 P.M. with 200 lbs. of
oil and 300 lbs. of 500 all told
now have home to this day sent
up the fore top of the main yard
and 100 lbs. at 1 P.M. the ship out of
sight. With hands camped in
ships duty so ends the day

Sunday 17th

At this point the standing day
by 11³⁰ fine weather all hands camp
layed in ships duty &

Monday 18th

Wind and weather as usual.
standing by 11³⁰ at four o'clock
not full and washed off deck,
saw nothing of any consequence

Tuesday 19th

Light wind from the N.E.
standing by 11³⁰ fine weather
this day west the line is

Wednesday 20th

Nothing of any consequence
wind S.W. standing the same
set up the fore and main
tigger and met the hole
