Tuesday 29
Light wind steering N.W. fine
weather, nothing in sight to under the

Wednesday 30
This day fine weather light winds
from headway twenty days from
Ternimoroula and only half way
home so goes September
Lat 18.38
Long 50.13

October, Wednesday 1 - 1845

This day commences with a light
breeze from the N.E. fine weather
but nothing in sight, Lat 19.20
Long 50.50

Thursday 2
All this day light airs from the
Eastward steering N.W. about 10
trails wind from N.W. to N.

Friday 3
This day commences with light
airs and calm steering N.W.
repaired a leak started in each
of water 80

Saturday 4
All this day light airs and
calm middle part squally
of rain, saw porpoises at a
distance so under the day

Sunday October 5 - 1845
Brig Edward bound home

All this day fine weather with a
two knots breeze steering N.W. latter
part more wind, Lat 21.20
Long 57.08

Monday 6
This commences with a fine wind
from the N.E. steering N.W. saw
one sail standing to the Eastward
Lat 22.13
Long 58.05

Tuesday 7
Light winds from the N.E. steering
N.W. middle part calm & saw
one sail standing to the N.W.
Lat 23.08
Long 59.40

Wednesday 8
All this day light airs from the
N.E. steering N.W. middle
part calm, this day commences
steering N.W. for Larkley & Co.
Lat 24.00
Long 60.15

Thursday 9
First part calm N.E. with rain
middle part N.W. squally latter
part N.E. light airs with rain
in sight

Friday 10
This day commences with a fine
breeze from the N.W. middle part
squally with rain at night went
on board a merchant ship from
the west Indies, bound to London got
some papers and and his Long 60.13
at the time, latter part wind
steering N.W.
Lat 25.57
Long 61.08
