

Brig, Edward (Barred) Home

Saturday October 11th 1855

All this day calm, nothing in sight

Sunday 12th

This day commences with a light breeze
steering by the wind. made at part
more wind but part light air at day
standing on the starboard looks to end

Monday 13th
First part light air and squalls
of rain at 6 P.M. a breeze spring
up from the eastward steering
N.W. by N.

Tuesday 14th
All this day a fine head sail
breeze fresh the S. steering
N.W. with all sail set

Wednesday 15th
This day commences with a strong
breeze from the S.E. steering N.W.
latter part not so much wind steady
N.W. by N. all sail out

Thursday 16th
This day commences with light
air from the N.E. steering N.W. by N.
few at out for water head. floger molifs
sweep applies to, nothing in sight

Friday 17th
All this day strong breeze from
the N.E. steering N.W. by N. &
more makes the day

Saturday October 18th

Home
This day commences with a
strong breeze from the S.E. steering
N.W. by N. until three the N.W. by N.
with topsails set and came off

Sunday 19th
All this day fine weather light breeze
from the eastward steering N.W. by N.
all this day standing to till that nothing in
sight sail one sail to end the day

Monday 20th
This day commences with a light wind
from the eastward steering N.W. by N.
at one P.M. speak the bark Edward -
sailed from Newburyport and bound then
saw several other sail

Tuesday 21th
This day commences with a light breeze
from the S. steering N.W. at one P.M.
wind increased at three here to make
a reef to sail fore spencer top mast stay
sail wind N.E. & saw a sail off on
the steering to the N. at ten another
sailed in within 10 mile standing
at end the day

Wednesday 22th
All this day strong gales from
N.E. standing on the starboard
saw several sail
