Journal of a Voyage In Bark Humboldt

Thursday, June 4th 1826
At seven o'clock weighed anchor in two or
three fathoms water, with the wind S.W., at
10 o'clock in main top gallant sail, standing
on the night &
Friday 5th

Wind S.W. steering by the wind at ten
o'clock came to anchor in seven fathoms water.
At 11 o'clock put under way bearing N. Westerly
just three miles, at entrance Pines hole
S.W. Dist 4 miles &

Saturday 6th Wind S.W. thick fog saw
several sail at 1 o'clock sent a boat in fishing
all hands employed in ships duty at 6 o'clock
Sunday 7th (weighed anchor went through
Pines hole at 10 o'clock discharged the fore
Sails part strong breeze from the S.W.
middle and last part light wind from
N.W. at 2 o'clock got under full sail
S.W. bearing E. Dist 3 miles Westerly
S.W. bearing E. Dist 8 miles at 6 o'clock
S.W. bearing N.W. Dist 18 miles & wind
the wind bearing S.W. all sail out, at
1 o'clock wind hauled N.W. steering
by 5:00

Monday 8th Light air from the N.W. steering
N.W. by E. at 1 o'clock saw black fish bearing
and got one. At latter part wind N.E. steering
N.W. saw several sail &
Tuesday 9th
Commenced with the wind from the N.E. fine
weather saw black fish and porpoises & wind
part wind increased at 10 o'clock in the top
gallant sails. latter part strong gale from
S.W. bearing to under short reef top sails
and fore sail &

Remains on board Humboldt

Wednesday 10th - 11th
Strong gale from the S.W. with rain
at 1 o'clock saw several sail bearing to the N.E.
at latter part wind N.E. latter part wind

Thursday 12th
Light wind from the S.W. steering
N.W. saw several sail, &
Friday 13th

First part calm at 6 o'clock wind springing up
from the S.W. in a squall. at 10 o'clock
the topsails standing S.W. struck the gun
&
Saturday 14th

First part strong breeze from the S.W.
steering S.W. latter part wind light, saw
several sail. At 2 o'clock sailed the
we were in the northern edge of the Gulf

Sunday 15th
Light wind from the N.W. steering to the
S.W. & saw black fish and squid & all
this day a heavy swell remaining bearing from
the N.E.

Monday 16th
Light air steering to the S.W. & all
sail set, saw Dolphin and sent one or two
sail to the Eastward of us steering
about the same way that we were

Tuesday 17th
A fine breeze from the Westward steering
N.W. saw two sail at two o'clock spoke
the ship "Jame" bearing to the S.W.
2 days out got her longitude, S.W. &
at night single reef top sails steering
S.W. latter part squally with rain
saw several flying fish but no whales
saw a single standing to the N.E.
