

Tuesday July 7th 1846
 All this day light winds from the N.W.
 Fine weather with a clear sky standing
 Different courses at 9 AM spoke the
 Brig Goscoaster ahead of us. Capt. Hammer
 and crew out 80 ~~to~~ 80 sent several sail
 and a Diamond fish at 9 PM Capt
 Hammer went on board the Brig at night
 took in sail usual at 8 spoke the Brig again

Wednesday 8th
 First part squally with rain steering
 to the Eastward. saw several sail
 but no fish yet in sight at night
 heeled to the wind. Starboard tack on
 board at 11 AM saw blackfish heeled
 without success

Thursday 9th
 This day commenced with light winds
 and squalls of rain saw blackfish
 but did not get any. First part steering
 to the N.W. saw one sail. Latter part steering
 N.E. fine weather but no fish besides the day
 Left 8 AM 27
 Day 27 27

Friday 10th
 Fine weather, steering N.E. saw one sail, first
 part light air, the day employed in fitting
 rigging and rattling down the main and a
 little of every thing some sickness nothing
 in sight yet. Wind and almost thick mist

Saturday 11th
 First part we had a fine breeze from the
 Westward. middle lighter steering Different
 courses nothing in sight yet of any consequence
 at 6 AM saw a sail off our
 standing on the main heading to the N.
 of squid

Sunday July 12th 1846
 Light winds from the N steering off
 went courses working to the Eastward
 the water looks very lively fish of most
 all sorts excepting whales, & employed
 in ships duty such as setting up rigging
 and rattling down

Monday 13th
 Pleasant weather light winds from the
 N steering N.E. at 6 PM saw blackfish
 heeled and got one saw the Shear
 water chase 5000 or so at day light
 killed all hands and observed the Sea
 washed of mud soil latter part steering
 breeze steering to the N.E. saw one sail

Tuesday 14th
 Fine weather but steering breeze
 steering to the N at night took in sail
 heeled to with Starboard tack on
 board nothing in sight yet of any
 consequence. Latter part light winds from
 N.W. saw porpoises

Wednesday 15th
 Light winds from the N fine weather
 steering Easterly at 5 PM spoke the
 Brig Hadmut of Provincetown Capt
 Vesper 6 months out to sea. had not seen a
 whale for 3 months. this is rather long time
 the day boiled out the blackfish black
 or mackerel 3 barrels middle part cloudy light
 winds with rain

Thursday 16th
 Fine weather with a light breeze from
 Eastward steering by the wind heeling to the
 N.E. saw 2 sail standing to the N.E. at sun
 down took in sail for the night
