

Wednesday August 18 — 1826

This day commences with light winds from the Eastward standing on the wind working to the windward, saw several sail, at which bearing E. by N. Dist 12 miles the weather cleared at sunrise the town of Sagadahoc bearing N. Dist 6 1/2

Thursday 19

Light winds from the Eastward standing on the wind to the N.E. at sun set South part of St. Michael bearing N.E. by E. Dist eight miles, the wind shifted to the N.E. standing on the wind at about 10 o'clock took on board having about 1/2 at 6 o'clock touched to the E.

Friday 20

First part light winds from the N.W. steering E. by N. at sunset N.E. part of St. Michael bearing N.E. by E. Dist 12 miles, St. George N.W. by N. Dist 30 miles stormy weather at about 10 o'clock Dist 25 miles steering E. at sunrise land in sight yet bearing N.W. by N. Dist 20 miles this day commences with light winds from the N.E.

Saturday 21

Light winds from the N.E. steering on the wind to the Eastward at 4 P.M. touched to the Westward latter part wind hauled to the N. steering on the wind to the N.E.

Sunday 22

This day commences with a fine breeze from the Westward standing on the wind heading about N.W. at 2 P.M. saw black fish shoals and got 9 so ended the day

Monday August 23 — 1826

First part employed in catching the flock of the fish at 4 P.M. had the deck clear, at a light breeze sprang up from the Eastward steering N. latter part strong breezes from the N.E. steering N.E. by E. this day employed in picking out the fish

Tuesday 24

This day commences with a strong breeze from the N.E. steering N.E. by E. fine weather all sail out, saw black fish going to the windward eyes out, saw green turtles and porpoises first part employed in picking out the fish at four o'clock down turned up about ten o'clock latter part squally with rain

Wednesday 25

Strong breezes from the N.E. with squalls of rain, steering N.E. by E. saw 2 porpoises and one sail so ended the day

Thursday 26

Strong breezes from the N.E. thick smoky weather with a heavy sea from the N.E. steering N.E. by E. at 8 o'clock steering N.W. so ended the day

Friday 27

Strong breezes from the N.E. steering N.E. at one saw Saint Michael bearing N.W. by E. Dist 25 miles middle part steering N.W. latter part wind hauled about 8 o'clock

Saturday 28

This day commences with a fine wind from the Eastward steering N.W. at 11 o'clock saw a black fish at the quarters wore ship and stood for it
