

Wednesday November 23 - 1835

First part squally with rain at 6 P.M. passed the Brig Thomas Vander 100 lbs & months out. Latter part squally of rain, & wind.

Thursday 24

Squally weather saw one seal but no fish. Latter part milder with thick weather.

Friday 25

Thick squally weather with the wind N.E. steering by the wind saw several seals. Latter part clear sky with a light breeze.

Saturday 26

First part light wind fine weather, saw several seals, & latter part strong breeze from the N.E. steering by the wind to the N.E.

Sunday 27

This day commences with strong breezes from the N.E. with squalls of rain steering by the wind to the N.E. latter part the same. alt 18. 20 long 36. 20

Monday 28

Squally with rain wind N.E. steering by the wind to the S. and westerly on. saw killers. Bared to have to without success so much the day.

Tuesday, December 1 - 1836

Strong N.E. winds steering by the wind. milder part wind abated. saw porpoises. At night to see in with a wind at 5 P.M. passed the Brig Sam of Providence 2 months out 110 lbs. Spent 1/2 saw another Brig standing to the Eastward. Latter part light winds with a heavy sea so much the day.

Wednesday December 2

This day commences with light wind with a heavy sea on at 10 four saw whales going away out to the windward passed the boats but of no use at dark came one herring whales passing N.E. alt 18. 16 long 36. 28

Thursday 3

Thick cloudy weather with the wind N.E. a heavy sea from the N.E. at sun fifteen high saw whales 2 miles off. the weather began to clear the boats the whales went down at the time at dark they came up 1 mile off chased as long as we could see them and then was not being they were going about N.E. at 11 P.M. saw whales again at half past 11 got dinner so ended the day. alt 18. 19 long 36. 30

Friday 4

First part commenced a chasing whales at a fastened off from along side at 9, at sun down passed down stood 9 in a, washed at daylight sailed all hands on. alt 18. 20 commenced cutting at 11 past the day 36. 15 looks clear, & commenced fishing so much the day.

Saturday 5

Thick weather with some wind wind N.E. steering by the wind under single reef topsails to the N.E. this day employed in building, saw one seal steering to the N.W. & indicated by alt 18. 25 long 36. 31

Sunday 6

Light winds from the Northward, steering to the N.W. with a light wind & fine weather at 2 P.M. cooked down 10 the weather by boats crews. Latter part squally with rain. alt 18. 20 long 36. 11
