

Friday May 28th 1881

Commenced with light air & equal at four P.M. a fine breeze sprang up from W steering by the wind, lat 6.11.31

Saturday 29th Light winds from the W steering by the wind, lat 6.15.31, saw porpoises, lat 6.15.31, latter part calm, picked up a mouse

Sunday 30th This day commenced with a fine breeze from the W steering by the wind, at 2 P.M. saw land bearing the same lat 20 miles, Cape Decret or Port-au-Prince at 10 P.M. the E. part of the cape bearing W. Dist 1 mile. Left the current set us out 20 miles by sunrise at 8 to the square yards steering for Kolimka at 12 came to in 9 fathoms water & ended the day

Monday June 1st 1881
Fine weather nothing doing of consequence & plenty of stores on board to trade fruit and bags wool

Tuesday 2nd
At nine A.M. weighed anchor and went to sea steering by the wind, wind Cl. W. & ended the day

Wednesday 3rd
Fine weather steering by the wind at 2 P.M. & part of the day bearing by Dist 15 miles to our destination at eight A.M. saw a whale forrest two boats fastened killed one cut from the other & ended the day

Wednesday June 4th 1881

First part employed in whaling at 11 P.M. got one along side at sunset had him cut in commenced clearing decks at 4 P.M. whales in sight off our weather beam 5 miles off, latter part employed in whaling at 5.50

Thursday 5th
Fine weather employed in whaling, nothing in sight yet, at 7 P.M. cooled down, the works lat 6.36.31 day 9.19

Friday 6th
Commenced with fine weather employed in whaling, at daylight commenced steering lat 6.16.31 down, saw humbacks day 9.22

Saturday 7th
First part steering down at three P.M. washed of decks, stored down forty barrels, latter part employed in whaling lat 6.16.31 day 9.22

Sunday 8th
Fine weather, standing on the wharves, took a large beach, at one P.M. saw a large beach, but saw nothing more of it

Monday 9th
Light winds standing on the wharves, took a large beach, at one P.M. saw a large beach, but saw nothing more of it

Tuesday 10th
Wind Cl. W. standing on the wharves, took a large beach, at one P.M. saw a large beach, but saw nothing more of it

Wednesday 11th
Wind Cl. W. standing on the wharves, took a large beach, at one P.M. saw a large beach, but saw nothing more of it
