Commences with strong easterly winds standing to the S on the wind in company with the Bark Resident at sundown took in sail for the night. latter part steering W.N.W. dist 18.25
 Lat 17.88 Long 36.06

Wednesday 26

Fine weather first part steering W.N.W. at night took in sail as usual latter part light winds
 Lat 18.30 Long 36.00

Thursday 26

Light wind fine weather at 2 P.M. speak the Brig Franklin of Ramestown 11 months out 2500 p.m. All this day standing
 Lat 17.88 Long 36.01

Friday 27

Strong breezes standing on the wind to the S saw humbacks, and one seal. Big Thompson
 Lat 19.18 Long 36.28

Saturday 28

Fine weather steering by the wind to the S and W saw one sail, and humbacks, all the 24 hours fine weather & light winds

Sunday 29

Light winds from the S to standing to the S, saw humbacks,
 Lat 20.32 Long 36.35

Monday 30

Commences with light airs fine weather standing on the wind. saw porpoises, and finbacks, and one seal,
 Lat 21.33 Long 36.41

Tuesday 31

This day commences with fine weather as usual, nothing worth mentioning
 Lat 19.33 Long 36.25

Wednesday September 1

Strong breezes from the S to standing to the S, dist 18.13 under two top sails, saw a seal, and finbacks at 4 P.M. struck and green water latter steering S.W.
 Lat 18.13 Long 36.13

Thursday September 2 1827

Commences with strong breezes, steering S.W. latter part steering by the wind heading
 Lat 17.40 Long 36.30

Friday 3

Fine weather but no whales at 5 P.M. speak the Bark Champion of Westport 50 tons 7 months out this day sails with light winds
 Lat 18.42 Long 36.15

Saturday 4

Light winds from the N.E. fine weather saw several sail at sundown took in sail for the night heading to the S.E. aboard took on board
 Lat 18.50 Long 36.20

Sunday 5

Light winds with squalls of rain this day standing on the starboard tack, saw the Bark Champion off our lee, saw porpoises
 Lat 19.35 Long 37.11

Monday 6

Wind and weather the same, saw two sails Whalers, and grampuses, latter part wind headed to the Southward
 Lat 18.50 Long 37.10

Tuesday 7

Strong breezes with squalls of rain first standing on the starboard tack latter part on the starboard, saw one sail
 Lat 17.18 Long 36.52

Wednesday 8

Wind and as usual, steering by the wind, saw one sail, and a plenty of flying fish
 Lat 18.10 Long 36.54

Thursday 9

Strong easterly winds with heavy squalls of rain and rain saw one sail, and a plenty of flying fish and Birds but no Whales
 Lat 17.25 Long 36.32
