Commences with fine weather, but no fish to
standing on the dabbard's back. fath 12.5
long 35.58

Thursday 30

This day spindly with rain standing to the
Northward saw nothing worth mention. fath 19.5
long 30.55

Friday October 1

Light winds from the N standing on the dabbard's
back at 3 A.M. wind hauled to the N. fath 19.5
long 35.39
with heavy squalls of rain latter part steering N.

Saturday 2

Strong breezes from the N steering N under chimes
up topsails and fore sail fine weather. fath 17.5
long 35.9

Sunday 3

Commences with strong N.W. winds with a few
sail nothing in sight until saw half an hour
high saw a whale off the dabbard's back
half a mile off boreed the Boats in pursuit
got within four ships lengths, came on board
without through latter part standing on
the N back until 2 A.M. then on N back. fath 16.5
long 35.38

Monday 4

Strong easterly winds with heavy squalls and
a heavy sea on, saw several sail at 8 A.M. fath 15.5
long 35.4
saw the bark Trident of Gardner
Main; from Liverpool bound to Rio de Janeiro

Tuesday 5

Fine weather saw several sail, and fishery from
puses. fath 15.5
long 35.35

Wednesday 6

Light winds fine weather, nothing worth mention
fath 16.5
long 35.06

Thursday October 7 1827

Commences with fine weather, light breezes
from the N steering to the Westward. fath 16.5
long 35.38
saw nothing worth mentioning

Friday 8

Fine weather as usual, but nothing in sight
first part steering N latter part N. fath 15.5
long 36.18

Saturday 9

Strong North wind steering N, saw grampuses
middle part hauled to the wind dabbard's
back. fath 17.5
long 35.58

Sunday 10

Strong breezes from Northward standing on the
wind, saw two sail at sun down close reef top
sails re latter part fine weather

Monday 11

Commences with fine weather middle part strong breeze
with heavy squalls of wind and rain at
sundown, close reef the topsails fath 17.5
long 36.08
to in the fore sail. No thunder and
lightning.

Tuesday 12

Strong gails with heavy squalls of wind and rain
thunder and lightning, saw one sail at 10 A.M.
boreed got 35 fathoms, on the water bank
standing to the Eastward, took at fath 16.5
long 36.10
4 P.M. soundings again got 35 fathoms
at 6 P.M. Blue water

Wednesday 13

Strong N.W. winds with a heavy sea on, steering
to the wind under short sail at 3 P.M. saw
one sail off the lee bow standing under
dabbard's back. No
