

Thursday October 14 1827

Strong gales from the S.W. with heavy squalls of wind and rain a heavy sea running every way. One saw porpoises, at sundown shot took the top sails but the J. Am. M. Spencer's boat 17.30 standing on the starboard tack, latter part moderated.

Friday 15
Fine weather, a cloudy sky saw nothing worth mentioning, latter part raining
alt 17.20
long 36.39

Saturday 16
Commons with cloudy and squall of rain saw two seals and a finback.

Sunday 17
Fine weather with a clear sky at three to four P.M. took a lunar observation of the sun and moon long 36.07 & long by chron 36.15 saw a sail. the latter part steering
alt 17.35
long 36.12

Monday 18
Fine weather with a strong breeze steering different courses saw several jumpers and humpbacks and one seal at 10 P.M.
alt 17.57
long 36.30
saw the Bark of Chase 30 humpbacks 20 seals

Tuesday 19
Fine weather as usual, in company with the Bark of Chase, at 1 P.M. spoke the Brig Juno nothing in sight worth mentioning
alt 18.09
long 37.00

Wednesday 20
Light winds from the Eastward, steering by the wind, saw four seal Whalers & no doubt
alt 18.07
long 37.18
latter part calm this day finished repairing the main sail sent it up &c

Thursday October 21 1827

Remainings with light airs from the S.W. steering by the wind saw several seal, Porpoises and flying fish latter calm saw some
alt 17.24
long 37.20
kind of fish &c

Friday 22
First part calm, at three P.M. wind sprang up from the S.W. standing on the starboard tack heading East &c, at 11 P.M. saw
alt 17.10
long 37.26
kickers board the boats, without meeting

Saturday 23
This day squally with rain, standing on the wind saw some kind of fish, and several
alt 17.20
long 37.20
sail

Sunday 24
Strong S.W. winds scattering by the wind saw jumpers and several seal at sundown took in sail for the night latter part fine weather
alt 17.23
long 37.23

Monday 25
Fine weather as usual nothing in sight worth mentioning
alt 18.50
long 36.45

Tuesday 26
Light winds fine weather at two P.M. spoke the Bark Regina of New York bound to Rio de Janeiro saw several porpoises
alt 18.38
long 37.00

Wednesday 27
Fine weather saw one seal, and jumpers this day steering S.W. standing two waterhoses, bound to Rio de Janeiro all these 24 hours employed in repairing sails
alt 18.36
long 37.00

Thursday 28
Fine weather steering S.W. saw humpbacks one seal &c this day employed in repairing sails
alt 18.02
long 37.00
