This day commences with strong southerly winds steering W by S and flying fish and sperm whales, sail steering to the southward.

Saturday 20

Strong breezes steering different courses at four P.M. land, Maricao Is. Dist 12 miles at sunset bearing N Dist 4 miles steering W by N. Breeze W by N, hauled to the W by N off shore during of an eye, at daylight steering to the N and W by N out at day.

Sunday 21

Thick foggy weather raised bearing N by N Dist 6 miles, at 2 P.M. came too in it. Father's water to end the day.

Friday November 19 1827

Fine weather, at six A.M. weighed anchor and went to sea, at the mouth of this Puerto Cruise bearing N 10 miles Dist.

Saturday 13

Light air steering S by E at 4 Rodante bearing N by E Dist 20 miles, the in company with the Theophilus Chase, latter part steering S by E, and nothing worth mentioning.

Sunday 14

Thick cloudy weather steering by the wind, bearing S by E, in company with the Chase latter part hailing, a heavy sea on.

Monday 15

Strong southerly winds with rain at 11 P.M. and Blackfish chased the Boats without success the chase still in sight this day a heavy sea running S, this day steering S by E saw Jumpers &c.

Thursday November 16 1827

Commences with a light breeze and a heavy swell, steering S by E, saw several sail, and a grampus this day makes with strong breezes.

Wednesday 17

Strong breezes with a heavy sea steering S by E he turned up the Starboard Boat. this day ends with squalls of wind and rain.

Thursday 18

Strong southerly breezes with squalls of raging steering S by E latter part fine weather sent down the fore topsail and sent another in its place sent in the fore topsail &c.

Friday 19

Commences with fine weather steering S by E this day employed in repairing the fore topsail. He laid a sprit and a great number of fish one Atlantic &c.

Saturday 20

Fine weather, with the wind S by E steering S by E, saw porpoises, this day employed in repairing the fore topsail, latter part wind hauled to the S by E.

Lat 26.38
Long 80.26

Sunday 21

Fine weather but a strong S by E wind, great squalls steering S by E at four A.M. and hauled to the S in a squall lay abt to make about reef topsails &c. makes the day.

Lat 27.58
Long 88.10

Monday 22

This day commences with gale of wind from the S by E laying to under short reef topsails latter part fine weather.

Lat 28.18
