

Saturday 4 of March — 1848

Commenced with fine weather but a heavy sea, strong wind, N.W. steering N.E. 40. saw one sail, latter part fine weather long 29.00 spread ship Vatica Vatica 26.00, Adams Master

Sunday 5 Light winds from the N.W. steering N.E. in company with ship 22.30 Vatica of New Bedford. Capt Adams long 40.58

Monday 6 Light winds as usual standing on the Lullboard tack heading E. 20. saw two sail. long 32.09

Tuesday 7 This day commenced with fine weather wind N.E. standing on long 38.57 the Lullboard tack, latter part heading E, saw one sail to the N.E. Vatica of New Bedford.

Wednesday 8 Fine weather wind N.E. standing on the wind to the Eastward, saw several flying fish, latter part wind long 32.50. N.W. steering N.E. by ship Vatica heading N.E. 40 this day took up the Sheathing of deck.

Thursday 9 Light winds from the N.W. steering N.E. by ship saw several sail, a school of porpoises long 33.01

Friday 10 This day begins with light winds from the Eastward steering N.E. saw two fair sail, and porpoises latter long 31.31 part strong breezes

Saturday 11 Strong N.W. winds steering N.E. saw two sail, three or four porpoises long 33.20 with strong breezes laying to wind. On the N.W. top sails heading N.E.

Sunday 12 March — 1848

Moderate gales of winds and rain from the N.W. by ship too under short sail heading N.E. took in the Mast Boat 26.00 latter part fine weather made still sail.

Monday 13 Fine weather over head but a heavy sea, wind N.E. standing on the wind to the Eastward at 7 P.M. heading 22.57 eclipsed, latter part fine weather

Tuesday 14 Light winds from the N.W. fine weather standing on the wind at 5 P.M. saw three sprits supposed them to be Grampus latter part fine weather long 28.10

Wednesday 15 Fine weather as usual

Winds N.E. standing on the Eastward tack heading E. 20. saw flying fish & killed a. long 32.57

Thursday 16 Fine weather wind N.E. saw a great number of small fish alongside, latter part wind N.E. standing on the Eastward long 32.15 tack

Friday 17 Commenced with a fine breeze from the Northward standing on the Eastward tack Middle and long 31.26 latter part squally with rain.

Saturday 18 This day wind North squally standing on the Lullboard tack heading E. 20. saw Killers long 30.16

Sunday 19 Light winds from the N.W. standing on the Lullboard tack heading E. 20. by ship looking very thick to the N.W. 20.19 latter part squally with rain. On the N.W. 20.20 and Light winds wind turned to the N.W. 40 in the squalls
