

Monday March 27.

1838

This day commenced with light winds and
squalls of rain with Thunder and Lightning
better part fine weather with the S.W. wind
winds S, steering N by E Long 27.42

Tuesday 28th Fine weather winds
S steering N by E with all sail set, Lat 24.55
middle S latter parts wind E by E Long 28.12
steering by the wind.

Wednesday 29th Wind E by E with
squalls of rain, steering by the wind, saw
one sail standing to the Southward Lat 24.55
and one standing to the Northward, Long 29.05
latter part wind N by E.

Thursday 30th Strong N.W. wind
with squalls of rain, steering by the wind
saw several sail, wind in squalls Lat 24.55
Long 29.51

Friday 31st Fine weather winds
N steering by the wind heading N by W
and N by E saw one sail Lat 21.55
Long 31.15

Saturday April 1st Long 31.28

Light winds, fine weather standing on
the Starboard tack heading N by W and
N by E saw several sail Lat 21.55
Long 32.11

Sunday 2nd Light airs from
the Northward standing on the river be-
ing N by W by N by E at two o'clock to-
ward, at six Vizcagaya & English
Bark, standing to the Eastward on the river
at eight P.M. spoke her, Thomas Hughes
from St. Joseph, Phillips Long 33.29
the Island Borneo London &c

Monday April 3rd

1838

Light wind from the N.W. standing
on the Starboard tack heading N by E
in company with Barque Thomas Hughes
about the afternoon on board Lat 19.55
this day calms with fine breeze Long 31.25
from the N.W. cant a periscope

Tuesday 4th This day commenced
with fine weather, wind N.W. standing
on the Starboard tack, saw one sail, Lat 19.55
latter parts squally with rain Long 31.23

Wednesday 5th Light airs from
the N.W. steering N by W Middle part wind
N with rain & saw one sail, latter Long 31.23
part wind E & Thursday 6th

commenced with light airs from the
Eastward steering N by E all sail set, saw
saw several sail, one N.W. about the
mile off standing to the N by E Lat 16.28
Long 31.35

Friday 7th Light airs from the
Eastward, with a heavy swell from the S,
steering N by E saw several sail, this day Lat 15.30
employed in painting the Boat Long 31.26
over head and pitched her in side sea

Saturday 8th Light winds as usual
from the Eastward fine weather, steer-
ing N by E saw several sail, latter Lat 15.27
part heading N by the wind Long 32.02

Sunday 9th This day commenced
with light winds from the N.W. steering
by the wind saw several sail, Lat 12.25
at eight P.M. sighted an English ship
steering to the N.W.
