

Monday January 5<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with light winds at W. turned S by E  
saw nothing but icebergs & in sight at one time  
middle part baffling winds from W. N. W. to N. accompanied  
with thick fog and snow squalls Ship on S. by S. coast  
took latter part brisk breezes at N. W. with thick  
snow squalls Ship working to the South threw  
ice At 10 A.M. pack ice a head Dist 1. Mid. more  
Ship to the North from 7 to 8 icebergs in sight  
at a time and small ice very thick Ends with  
thick snow squalls steering S a long the  
ice At 8 P.M. Lat. by account 66° 10. Long by 174° 10. E

Tuesday January 6<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with fresh breezes at N. W. attended  
with thick snow squalls steering different  
courses along the ice and looking for Whales  
At 3 P.M. saw one sperm whale close to  
a leary iceberg lower & lashed and killed the  
Quats ant site of the Ship 15/4 barn at one  
time fast the whale in a thick snow squall  
the whale died in 1/4 of a. Mid. of a leary iceberg  
At 6 took the whale a long ride 11 icebergs in  
sight from the deck and small ice very  
numerous At 8 P.M. Commenced cutting with  
strong breezes at N. W. and a thick snow  
storm At 4 A.M. finished cutting pack ice  
under our lee Dist 3. Mid. Made all sail to  
work off from the ice with light baffling  
winds and calm. the watch employed clearing a  
way the head ends with light winds at S.  
with thick fog squalls steering to the North  
13 icebergs in sight from the deck  
Lat by Obs 65.57. S. Long by 174.30. E

Wednesday January 7<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with light winds at S. E. with thick fog  
squalls At 1/2 past Meridian saw one leary  
sperm whale the fog shut in thick saw nothing  
more of the whale pack ice and numerous ice islands  
in sight Employed clearing up and coaming  
Boiling Middle part strong winds at W. N. W. Ship  
standing on off shore took to keep clear of the ice  
& icebergs in sight at one time Latter part baffling  
winds from W. N. E. part of the time light and part strong  
Ship heading towards the pack ice At 10 A.M. up with  
ice stern to the Eastward along the ice until 1/2 past  
then hauled to the N. W. saw several hump & Fin back  
Whales Employed Boiling  
Lat by Obs 65.44. S. Long by 174.36. E

Thursday January 8<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with strong winds at S. W. and  
overcast Ship heading W. N. W. under moderate  
sail Nothing in sight but ice and a plenty  
of that Employed Boiling Middle part  
much the same Latter part strong winds  
at S. W. Ship heading W. N. W. a plenty of icebergs  
in sight Employed Boiling and coaming oil  
Lat by Obs 65.14. S. Long by 174.40. E

Friday January 9<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with light baffling winds Ship  
heading to the Westward At 2 P.M. saw the pack  
ice bearing from N. to S. W. at 3 more Ship to  
the S. E. 18 icebergs in sight Employed Boiling  
and storing oil At 7 P.M. finished Boiling  
Middle part fresh breezes with thick fog and  
snow squalls Latter part variable winds  
and weather Ship standing on off shore  
lacks saw nothing but icebergs At 11 A.M.  
finished storing oil  
Lat by Obs 65.17. S. Long by 174.30. E
