

Saturday, January 10th

Commenced with fresh breeze at N.W. with thick fog & squalls. Ship heading S. Nothing in sight but ice and a plenty of that. Middle part baffling winds with thick fog. Ship on offshoot tacks to keep clear of the ice. Latter part light winds at S. with thick fog. Ship heading S.E. saw several Hump back Whales and a plenty of ice.

Lat by Obs 65.04. S Long by Chron 174.16. E

Sunday, January 11th

Commenced with light airs at S. with thick fog & squalls, icebergs very numerous. Middle part calm with light airs at N. accompanied with snow about yinches fell. Latter part light winds at N. with thick fog and rain. Ship heading S.E. saw nothing but ice.

No Obs Lat by account 65.10. Long by account 174.30. E

Monday, January 12th

Commenced with light baffling airs with thick fog and rain. Middle part light winds at S.W. Ship heading S.E. with thick fog. Latter part strong winds and overcast. Ship heading S.E. saw Hump and sulphur bottom Whales. Employed starting Coal and Coppering the Casks.

Lat by Obs 65.30. S Long by Chron 174.40.

Tuesday, January 13th

Commenced with light winds from S to S.E. with thick fog & squalls plenty of Hump back and sulphur bottom Whales in sight. 4 icebergs in sight ^{at} one time. At 9 P.M. a great mercy saw Elephant around the ship. Middle part light. Latter part moderate breeze from S to N.E. with fine pleasant weather. Ship heading from S.E. to S.S.E. saw several Hump back Whales. At 6 A.M. 57 icebergs in sight.

Lat by Obs 66.26. S Long by Chron 175.26. E

Wednesday, January 14th

Commenced with a fresh breeze at N. Ship heading E. Eastward at 1 P.M. wore Ship heads W.N.W. At 4 P.M. it blowing on to a fresh gale and a thick snow storm took in sail 20 icebergs in sight. Middle part fresh gales from N to S.E. with a thick snow storm. Ship under short. Latter part more moderate winds at S and overcast stores W.N.W. saw several Hump back Whales and a plenty of icebergs.

Lat by Obs 65.24. S Long by Chron 174.00

Thursday, January 15th

Commenced with light winds from S.E. to S.S.E. steering S.W. saw nothing but icebergs. Middle part light baffling winds from S to S.W. Latter part calm with thick overcast weather saw several Hump back Whales and a plenty of icebergs.

No Obs Lat by account 65.30. S Long by account 174.26. E

Friday, January 16th

Commenced with a calm. Nothing in sight but icebergs at 1 P.M. a breeze sprang up from S.E. steered S.W. At 1 P.M. sail set. Middle part winds and weather variable took in sail as caution required. At 1 A.M. the wind N.E. blowing a fresh gale and a thick snow storm, wore the Ship to heading S.E. under short sail. Latter part strong gales at N. with thick weather. Ship under short sail heading S.E. saw nothing but icebergs.

No Obs Lat by account 65.40. S Long by Chron 174.50

Saturday, January 17th

Commenced with fresh gales at N.E. with thick weather and rain. Ship heading N.W. under short sail saw plenty of icebergs. Middle part much the same. Latter part strong gales at N.E. and thick fog with rain. Ship heading W.N.W.

No Obs Lat by account 65.20. S Long by account 175.20. E
