

Tuesday February 24th

Commenced with fresh gales at 8 1/2 steering 8 1/2 N
 Oblique in sight. Middle part light steered 8 1/2 N
 under short sail. Latter part variable winds
 steered 8 1/2 N saw nothing but Fairbanks

Lat 44 10. Long 179 49 E

Wednesday February 25th

Commenced with fresh gales at N W with thick
 squally weather steering N 3/4 E. Middle
 part lay by under short sail. Latter
 part light winds at W steered 8 1/2 N. All
 drawing sail sit saw nothing

Lat 43 56. S. 130 E

Thursday February 26th

Commenced with fresh gales from W 1/2 W
 to W N W with thick squally weather
 At 2 P.M. made Chatham Island bearing
 for compass 3 dist 20 Miles. Sub to the
 N to clear the Clusters and West reef at
 sunset have the Ship to under storm
 sails heading N W. West reef dist 10 Miles
 bearing N 3/4 E. Middle and Latter parts
 hard gales and squalls harder from W 1/2 W to S W
 Ship under storm sail on opposite tacks
 Lat 43 14. S. Long 180 08 E.

Friday February 27th

Commenced with hard gales at S W and squalls
 harder Ship under storm sails. Middle part
 more moderate at the Main & Fore sail close reef
 and Fore sail. Ship standing on opposite tacks
 Latter part fresh breezes at W at daylight
 saw Chatham Island steered S E. in with
 the Land and then steered along the Land
 at 11 A.M. took 3 Natives on board. That in
 form as there was plenty of Potatoes on shore
 made the best of our way towards the place

Friday February 28th

Commenced with fresh breezes at W. Ship close to
 the Land At 1/2 past 2 P.M. came to anchor in 19 fathoms
 under the N E Cape of Chatham Island. Employed
 trading and bringing up Potatoes, Middle part
 calm and baffling winds. Latter part light baffling
 airs At 10 A.M. finished trading took on board
 about 12 tons Potatoes and 30 bags most of them
 heavy rice. ends with light baffling airs. All
 ready for sea. waiting for a breeze

Saturday February 29th

Commenced with light baffling airs and Calms
 At 9 P.M. a light breeze from N W got
 under way and steered out to sea. Middle
 and Latter part strong winds at N. Ship heading
 S N E. saw nothing

Lat 43 23. S. Long 186 08 E.

Monday March 1st

Commenced with strong winds at N 1/2 W
 Ship heading N 3/4 E. Middle and Latter fresh
 gales at W N W Ship heading N E. All powder
 sail sit saw nothing

Lat 44 29. S. Long 187 33 E.

Tuesday March 2nd

Commenced with fresh gales at N W Ship
 heading N W. Middle part Calm and baffling
 airs. Latter part strong winds at N W
 Ship heading N E. saw nothing but an
 addition of 7 Puppies to our family of young ones
 Lat 44 44. S. Long 188 49 E.
