

Monday May 10th
Commences with strong winds at W heading
N.W. Middle and Latter part strong gales with
snow squalls from S to S.W. accompanied with snow
Ship under storm sails heading W.S.W. to N.W.
saw Nothing. Lat by Obs 44,34. N. Long by Obs 187,01. W

Tuesday May 11th
Commences with hard gales from W.S.W. with thick
snow. Middle and Latter part hard gales from
W.S.W. Ship under storm sail headed to the
Northward. Lat by Obs 44,54. N. Long by Obs 186,32. W

Wednesday May 12th
Commences with strong gales at W.S.W. Ship
heading S.W. Middle and Latter part strong
winds at W. Ship heading S.W. saw Nothing but
pinkbacks. Lat by Obs 50,59. N. Long by Obs 186,54. W

Thursday May 13th
Commences with strong winds at W heading
N.W. All forenoon sail set. Middle part strong
winds from N.W. to W.S.W. Ship heading W.S.W. to S.W.
Latter part light winds at W heading N.W.
All sail set saw Nothing.
Lat by Obs 51,21. N. Long by Obs 187,48. W

Friday May 14th
Commences with strong winds from W.S.W. Ship
heading N.W. At 6 P.M. saw the Rat Islands
bearing per compass from N to N.E. Dist 30 Miles
Middle part strong winds at W.S.W. Ship
on Gipsy's tack. Latter part light winds at W. steering
to the Northward and Eastward between the Islands
being guided by the Land. At 10 P.M. and 11 P.M.
saw plenty of Hump Back Whales
At 6 Lat by the Sun 51,50. Long by the Sun 188,12. W
Lat by Obs 186,52. W

Saturday May 15th
Commences with light winds at N.W. by W. Ship heading
N.W. the Islands Dist 4 Miles. Middle and Latter part
light babbling airs from N.W. accompanied with snow
squalls. Ship heading N.W. saw Nothing but
Humpback and Sulphur-bottom Whales.
Lat by Obs 53,33. N. Long by Obs 188,31. W

Sunday May 16th
Commences with light winds at N.W. with
snow squalls. Ship heading N.W. At 6 P.M.
spoke Ship City of New Bedford Eldredg 500 Tons
Middle and Latter part light winds at N.W. Ship
heading N.W. and N.E. At 4 P.M. saw one
Barrow's Whale giving quick. At 11 didn't lower
Lat by Obs 55,12. N. Long by Obs 187,35. W

Monday May 17th
Commences with strong winds at N.W.
heading S.W. by W. Middle part variable winds and
light heading to the Westward. Latter part strong
winds at S.W. accompanied with thick snow squalls
Ship heading N.W. by W. saw one or two Whales lowered
to no purpose. At 6 Lat by Obs 55,00. Long by Obs 188,20

Tuesday May 18th
Commences with light winds at W with a thick
snow storm. Middle part light winds at S.
steered W.S.W. at daylight saw one Ship Boatswain
saw one or two Whales lowered to no purpose at 9 A.M.
saw 2 Whales lowered to no purpose. Latter part
winds from S accompanied with snow squalls
Ship standing on Gipsy's tack as course
required
