

Tuesday May 25th

Commenced with strong gales at N.W. accompanied with thick snow squalls. Ship lagging with the Whale along side, at 6 P.M. the black chain parted and a way went the Whale. Made all prudent sail Middle and Latter part strong gales at N.W. & W. Ship standing on her own tack and steering different courses to find the Whale, but all to no purpose saw several Whales to ridge to Whale. Employed repairing the Starboard Boat.

Thursday May 27th

Commenced with light winds at W & W. Nothing in sight but 2 Ships, Middle part strong winds at W. with thick weather. Latter part light winds at W. Ship speaking to the Southard and Eastward saw no Whales spoke Ship Citizen Boston New Bedford 758 tons. Lat & Long 56, 16. N. Long & Chron 188, 25. W

Friday May 28th

Commenced with a calm Nothing in sight but one Ship Employed repairing the Starboard Boat. Middle part hailing, Latter part fresh gale at N.E. with thick rainy weather. Ship under short sail, Nothing in sight of any account. Lat & Long 56, 20. N. Long & Chron 188, 15. W

Saturday May 29th

Commenced with fresh gales at N.E. accompanied with thick rainy weather. Middle and Latter part light hailing winds with thick fog squalls Ship speaking to the Southard, spoke Ship George and Mary Green New London & Whales this season. Lat & Long 56, 57. N. Long & Chron 188, 06. W

Sunday May 30th

Commenced with light winds and Calm with fog squalls. 2 Ships in sight, Middle and Latter part light winds and Calm from Eastward with thick fog squalls Ship heading to the Southard, Nothing in sight but Ships. Lat & Long 57, 35. N. Long & Chron 188, 30.

Monday May 31st

Commenced with light winds from Eastward with thick fog squalls 7 Ships in sight one Railing, Middle part much the same Latter part light winds at N.W. heading N.E. saw Nothing but Ship Employed repairing the Starboard Boat. Lat & Long 58, 04. N. Long & Chron 188, 41. W

Tuesday June 1st

Commenced with light winds at N.W. heading N.E. Nothing in sight, Middle part light winds at W. steered N.W. Latter part light hailing winds at N.W. saw Nothing but Ship. Lat & Long 59, 20. N. Long & Chron 188, 54. W

light winds at N.W. heading N.E. 4 Ship in sight, N. 7 spoke Ship Bruno Thicks & William Hamilton Nothing Middle and Latter part variable winds, steered South saw Nothing but Ship
