in sight, Emplage & vessels, took a few strokes in
the Fore Topsail and Foresail.

Friday June 4th

Commenced with light airs at W & W steering
East. & Ships in sight, Middle and Latter part
light winds at S & W, steered S. saw Nothing but
Ships Lat by Obs 57.33. N. Long by Chron 184.56. W

Saturday June 5th

Commenced with light winds from S steering
East. & Ship in sight, at 5 P.M. spoke Ship Warren
Smith old Town Nothing. Middle part Latter
part light winds from Southern and Eastward
with fine pleasant weather Ship heading Eastward
Nothing in sight but one Ship
Lat by Obs 57.33. N. Long by Chron 184.18. W

Sunday June 6th

Commenced with light winds at S steering
N.E. Nothing in sight, Middle and Latter part
light baffling airs at S.E. saw Nothing but
Ships Lat by Obs 58.17. N. Long by Chron 178.47. West

Monday June 7th

All the 24 hours light winds from S.E. to S
with overcast weather Ship heading S. N.E.
to N. saw Nothing but Ships and Gunboats
spoke Ship Sagoda Tobey, & Whales
No Obs Lat by account 58.45. N. Long by account 178.00.

Thursday June 8th

Commenced with light winds at S and overcast
heading N.N.E. 3 Ships in sight Middle part light
winds at S. heading S by S under short sail at 5 A.M.
saw the ice Latter part strong winds at S steered
to the S.W. being guided by the ice saw Nothing
Lat by Obs 57.20. N. Long by account 177.30. W

Friday June 9th

Commenced with fresh gales at S. heading
S.E. accompanied with thick rainy weather
Middle and Latter part strong gales from S to N.E.
with thick weather lay by under storm sails
saw Nothing No Obs Lat by account 58.50. N. Long 177.20. W

Thursday June 10th

Commenced with strong gales at N.E. with
thick weather Ship heading S.E. Middle part
variable with thick fog, Latter part light
airs at N.E. saw 2 or 3 Whales a Cow and Calf
lowered and fastened to Leather Whales and killed
No Obs Lat by account ^{58.20} 58.20. N. Long by account 177.30

Friday June 11th

Commenced with light baffling airs at N.E.
the Boat, up part to the Whales, the Cow sunk
At 5 P.M. took the Calf a long ride, got
dinner and commenced cutting at 9 finished
Middle part Calm, Latter part strong winds
at S. with thick fog squalls. steered S. N.E.
3 Ships in sight, Emplage & Reeling
Lat by Obs 58.25. Long by account 175.30. W
